AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to longevity in title for investigative employees of the division of state police

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 215 of the executive law, as amended by chapter 478 of the laws of 2004, is amended to read as follows:

The sworn members of the New York state police shall be appointed by the superintendent and permanent appointees may be removed by the superintendent only after a hearing. MEMBERS WHO HAVE BEEN ASSIGNED OR APPOINTED AS INVESTIGATORS OR SENIOR INVESTIGATORS INTHEBUREAU OF CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION OR AS A STATION COMMANDER, CORPORAL, ZONE COMMAN-DER, ZONE SERGEANT, FIRST SERGEANT, STAFF SERGEANT, CAPTAIN OR MAJOR FOR PERIOD OF THREE CONTINUOUS YEARS OR MORE MAY BE REMOVED OR DEMOTED FROM SUCH ASSIGNMENT OR APPOINTMENT ONLY AFTER A HEARING, THE WHICH SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE SUPER-INTENDENT OF STATE POLICE; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT A HEARING SHALL BE REQUIRED WHEN REDUCTION IN RANK FROM SUCH POSITION IS BASED SOLELY ON THEECONOMY, CONSOLIDATION OR ABOLITION OF FUNCTIONS, CURTAILMENT OF ACTIVITIES OR OTHERWISE. No person shall be appointed to the New York state police force as a sworn member unless he or she shall a citizen of the United States, between the ages of twenty-one and twenty-nine years except that in the superintendent's discretion, maximum age may be extended to thirty-five years. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any general or special law to the contrary the time spent on military duty, not exceeding a total of six years, shall subtracted from the age of any applicant who has passed his or her twenty-ninth birthday, solely for the purpose of permitting qualifica-

tion as to age and for no other purpose. Such limitations as to age however shall not apply to persons appointed to the positions of first assistant counsel, assistant counsel, and assistant deputy superintendent for employee relations nor to any person appointed to the 5 bureau of criminal investigation pursuant to section two hundred sixteen 6 this article nor shall any person be appointed unless he or she has 7 fitness and good moral character and shall have passed a physical 8 mental examination based upon standards provided by the rules and requlations of the superintendent. Appointments shall be made for a proba-9 10 tionary period which, in the case of appointees required to attend and 11 complete a basic training program at the state police academy, include such time spent attending the basic school and terminate one 12 13 year after successful completion thereof. All other sworn members shall 14 subject to a probationary period of one year from the date of 15 appointment. Following satisfactory completion of the probationary period the member shall be a permanent appointee. Voluntary resignation or 16 17 withdrawal from the New York state police during such appointment shall 18 be submitted to the superintendent for approval. Reasonable time shall 19 required to account for all equipment issued or for debts or obli-20 gations to the state to be satisfied. Resignation or withdrawal from the 21 division during a time of emergency, so declared by the governor, 22 not be approved if contrary to the best interest of the state and shall 23 be a misdemeanor. No sworn member removed from the New York state police shall be eligible for reappointment. The superintendent shall make rules 24 25 and regulations subject to approval by the governor for the discipline 26 and control of the New York state police and for the examination and qualifications of applicants for appointment as members thereto and such 27 28 examinations shall be held and conducted by the superintendent 29 such rules and regulations. The superintendent is authorized to charge a fee of twenty dollars as an application fee for any person 30 applying to take a competitive examination for the position of trooper, 31 32 and a fee of five dollars for any competitive examination for a civilian 33 position. The superintendent shall promulgate regulations subject to the 34 approval of the director of the budget, to provide for a waiver of 35 application fee when the fee would cause an unreasonable hardship on the applicant and to establish a fee schedule and charge fees for the use of 36 37 state police facilities. 38

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
