AN ACT to amend the judiciary law, in relation to judicial wellness or assistance committees

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The judiciary law is amended by adding a new article 22-A to read as follows: 3

6 S 857. JUDICIAL WELLNESS OR ASSISTANCE COMMITTEES. 1. CONFIDENTIAL 7 INFORMATION PRIVILEGED. THE CONFIDENTIAL RELATIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS 8 BETWEEN A MEMBER OR AUTHORIZED AGENT OF A JUDICIAL WELLNESS OR ASSIST-9 ANCE COMMITTEE SPONSORED BY A STATE OR LOCAL BAR ASSOCIATION AND ANY 10 FIRM OR CORPORATION COMMUNICATING WITH SUCH COMMITTEE, ITS PERSON, MEMBERS OR AUTHORIZED AGENTS, SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE PRIVILEGED ON THE 11 SAME BASIS AS THOSE PROVIDED BY LAW BETWEEN ATTORNEY AND CLIENT. SUCH 12 PRIVILEGE MAY BE WAIVED ONLY BY THE PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION WHICH 13 HAS FURNISHED INFORMATION TO THE COMMITTEE. THIS PRIVILEGE SHALL NOT 14 EXTEND TO INFORMATION RECEIVED BY A JUDGE OR LAWYER SERVING AS A MEMBER 15 OF A JUDICIAL WELLNESS OR ASSISTANCE COMMITTEE THAT A JUDGE IS COMMIT-16 TING OR IS LIKELY TO COMMIT A SUBSTANTIAL VIOLATION OF THE RULES GOVERN-17 18 ING JUDICIAL CONDUCT.

19 2. IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY. ANY PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION IN GOOD 20 FAITH PROVIDING INFORMATION TO, OR IN ANY OTHER WAY PARTICIPATING IN THE 21 AFFAIRS OF, ANY OF THE COMMITTEES REFERRED TO IN SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS 22 SECTION SHALL BE IMMUNE FROM CIVIL LIABILITY THAT MIGHT OTHERWISE RESULT REASON OF SUCH CONDUCT. FOR THE PURPOSE OF ANY PROCEEDING, THE GOOD 23 BY FAITH OF ANY SUCH PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION SHALL BE PRESUMED. 24 25 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
