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Introduced by M. of A. MAYER, BUCHWALD, GALEF, PRETLOW -- read once and referred to the Committee on Housing

AN ACT to amend the emergency tenant protection act of nineteen seventy-four, in relation to public members of a rent guidelines board

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision a of section 4 of section 4 of chapter 576 of the laws of 1974 constituting the emergency tenant protection act of nineteen seventy-four, as amended by chapter 349 of the laws of 1979, is amended to read as follows:

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a. In each county wherein any city having a population of less than million or any town or village has determined the existence of an emergency pursuant to section three of this act, there shall be created rent guidelines board to consist of nine members appointed by the commissioner of housing and community renewal upon recommendation of the county legislature which recommendation shall be made within thirty days after the first local declaration of an emergency in such county; such members shall be representative of tenants, two shall be representative of owners of property, and five shall be public members each of shall have had at least [five] TWO years experience in either finance, economics or housing. THE PUBLIC MEMBERS MAY NOT BE EMPLOYED BY AN ORGANIZATION, LAW FIRM, OR OTHER ENTITY WHICH PREDOMINANTLY REPRES-OR ADVISES LANDLORDS OR TENANTS AS PART OF THEIR BUSINESS OR PRAC-TICE. One public member shall be designated by the commissioner to serve as chairman and shall hold no other public office. No member, officer or employee of any municipal rent regulation agency or the state division of housing and community renewal and no person who owns or manages real estate covered by this law or who is an officer of any owner or organization shall serve on a rent guidelines board. One public member, one member representative of tenants and one member representative of shall serve for a term ending two years from January first next owners succeeding the date of their appointment; one public member, one member representative of tenants and one member representative of owners shall serve for terms ending three years from the January first next succeed-

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ing the date of their appointment and three public members shall serve for terms ending four years from January first next succeeding the dates of their appointment. Thereafter, all members shall serve for terms four years each. Members shall continue in office until their succes-5 sors have been appointed and qualified. The commissioner shall fill 6 vacancy which may occur by reason of death, resignation or otherwise in 7 a manner consistent with the original appointment. A member may be 8 removed by the commissioner for cause, but not without an opportunity to 9 be heard in person or by counsel, in his defense, upon not less than ten 10 days notice. Compensation for the members of the board shall be at the rate of one hundred dollars per day, for no more than twenty days a 11 year, except that the chairman shall be compensated at the rate of one 12 13 hundred twenty-five dollars a day for no more than thirty days a year. 14 board shall be provided staff assistance by the division of housing 15 and community renewal. The compensation of such members and the costs of staff assistance shall be paid by the division of housing and community 16 17 renewal which shall be reimbursed in the manner prescribed in THIS section [four of this act]. The local legislative body of each city 18 19 having a population of less than one million and each town and village 20 in which an emergency has been determined to exist as herein provided 21 shall be authorized to designate one person who shall be representative 22 of tenants and one person who shall be representative of owners of property to serve at its pleasure and without compensation to advise and assist the county rent guidelines board in matters affecting the adjust-23 24 25 rents for housing accommodations in such city, town or village of 26 as the case may be. 27

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately; provided that the amendments to section 4 of the emergency tenant protection act of nineteen seventy-four made by section one of this act shall expire on the same date as such act expires and shall not affect the expiration of such act as provided in section 17 of chapter 576 of the laws of 1974.
