AN ACT to amend the public authorities law, in relation to establishing a committee on safety within the metropolitan transportation authority

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subdivision 4 of section 1263 of the public authorities law, as amended by chapter 549 of the laws of 1994, is amended to read as follows:

(b) The chairman shall establish committees to assist him in the performance of his duties and shall appoint members of the authority to such committees. Among such committees, there shall be a committee on operations of the New York city transit authority, the Manhattan and Bronx surface transit operating authority and the Staten Island rapid transit operating authority; a committee on operations of the Long Island Rail Road and the metropolitan suburban bus authority; a committee on operations of the Metro-North commuter railroad; a committee on operations of the Triborough bridge and tunnel authority; a committee on finance; [and] a committee on capital program oversight; AND A COMMITTEE ON SAFETY. In addition to such appointed members, each of the non-voting members referred to in subparagraph two of paragraph (a) of subdivision of this section shall serve on the committee on capital program oversight, the committee on finance, THE COMMITTEE ON SAFETY, committee on operations of the Triborough bridge and tunnel authority, and the operations committee relevant to the commuter council that recommended such member. The alternate non-voting members shall each serve on the respective operations committee relevant to the commuter council that recommended each member. The committee on capital program

The CAPITAL PROGRAM committee shall issue a quarterly 38 report on its activities and findings, and shall in connection with the 39 40 preparation of such quarterly report, consult with the state division of the budget, the state department of transportation, the members of the 41 metropolitan transportation authority capital program review board 42 other group the committee deems relevant, including public employee 43 44 organizations, and, at least annually, with a nationally recognized 45 independent transit engineering firm. Such report shall be made available to the members of the authority, to the members of the metropolitan 46 47 transportation authority capital program review board, and the directors 48 of the municipal assistance corporation for the city of New York. 49

- (b) The chairman shall establish committees to assist him in the performance of his duties and shall appoint members of the authority to such committees. Among such committees, there shall be a committee on operations of the New York city transit authority, the Manhattan and Bronx surface transit operating authority and the Staten Island rapid

transit operating authority; a committee on operations of the Long 2 Island Rail Road and the metropolitan suburban bus authority; a commit-3 on operations of the Metro-North commuter railroad; a committee on operations of the Triborough bridge and tunnel authority; a committee on 5 finance; [and] a committee on capital program oversight; AND A COMMITTEE 6 SAFETY. The committee on capital program oversight shall include not 7 less than [three] FOUR members, and shall include the chairpersons of 8 the committee on operations of the New York city transit authority, the Manhattan and Bronx surface transit operating authority and the Staten 9 10 Island rapid transit operating authority, the committee on operations of 11 the Long Island Rail Road and the metropolitan suburban bus authority, [and] the committee on operations of the Metro-North commuter 12 13 COMMITTEE ON SAFETY. The CAPITAL PROGRAM committee shall issue a quarterly 45 report on its activities and findings, and shall in connection with the preparation of such quarterly report, consult with the state division of 46 47 the budget, the state department of transportation, the members 48 metropolitan transportation authority capital program review board and any other group the committee deems relevant, including public 49 50 organizations, and, at least annually, with a nationally recognized independent transit engineering firm. Such report shall be made avail-51 52 able to the members of the authority, to the members of the metropolitan transportation authority capital program review board, and the directors 53 54 of the municipal assistance corporation for the city of New York. 55

S 3. This act shall take effect immediately, provided that the amendments to paragraph (b) of subdivision 4 of section 1263 of the public

authorities law made by section one of this act shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such subdivision pursuant to section 3 of
