AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to including employees of the office of children and family services on the list of public employees for which prevention of duties qualifies as assault in the second degree

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivisions 3 and 11 of section 120.05 of the penal law, 2 as amended by chapter 196 of the laws of 2014, are amended to read as follows:

S 4. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that section two of this act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as chapter 487 of the laws of 2015, takes effect; provided, further, that section three of this act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as chapter 472 of the laws of 2015, takes effect.
