AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to creating and authorizing the presentation of the "civilian medal of valor"; and to amend the state finance law, in relation to establishing the "civilian medal of valor fund"

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Legislative intent. The legislature hereby finds that 1 the 2 terrorist attacks on the World Trade Towers on the morning of September 11, 2001 have forever changed the lives of all residents of New York 3 4 state, the United States of America and all other countries of the 5 world. These cowardly and barbaric acts have deprived thousands upon 6 thousands of citizens and individuals throughout the world of their 7 loved ones, and the comfort, support and the security of knowing that 8 live in a safe place. Today, thousands of United States military they personnel are risking their lives and personal safety, and are separated 9 from their family members so that they may protect the citizens of our 10 great nation and to attempt to bring the masterminds behind the cowardly 11 12 September eleventh to justice. The laws of this state and events of 13 country already provide for various awards, medals and decorations for military personnel who in the service of our country, or in the service 14 15 of the organized militia of this state have displayed conspicuous acts 16 of valor, heroism, courage or gallantry, either in their military capacities or in a civilian capacity. These medals, decorations and honors 17 include a conspicuous service cross that is presented in the name of the 18 19 legislature of the state by the governor. The events of September elev-20 enth brought about untold numbers of heroic acts and deeds by so many of 21 the public servants of the state, including firefighters and police officers of the city of New York and police officers of the port author-22

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ity of New York and New Jersey as well as ordinary citizens who risked 1 2 their lives and personal safety to aid and assist others during these 3 events, and the carnage and destruction that immediately followed. In 4 the months and years ahead, the citizens of this state are likely to 5 encounter other and further acts of terrorism that will affect their 6 safety and well being. Events such as the September eleventh terrorist 7 attacks brought out the true nature of the citizens of this great state. 8 In a time of extreme crisis and need, hundreds and thousands of New Yorkers risked life, limb and safety to assist others in similar need 9 10 and distress. Countless others toiled tirelessly in food banks, blood banks and charitable organizations throughout all of New York. It is the 11 12 intent of this act to honor the "ordinary citizens" of New York that perform unselfish, courageous acts of gallantry that are worthy of 13 14 special recognition and honor by the legislature, the governor and all 15 of the citizens of the state. While no action can truly recognize or 16 repay these civilian heroes for their selfless acts of courage and 17 heroism, the legislature finds and determines that it is appropriate to 18 create, pursuant to the terms of this act, the "civilian medal of 19 valor". The civilian medal of valor shall be awarded, in the name of the 20 grateful residents of the state of New York, to the residents of this 21 state that have, either, already displayed a conspicuous act of heroism 22 or courage in assisting other residents of New York, as well as, the 23 residents of other countries, or that may do so in the future.

24 S 2. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 10 to read 25 as follows:

26 S 10. CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR. 1. THE GOVERNOR IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO 27 PRESENT IN THE NAME OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND ON 28 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, A CIVILIAN MEDAL, TO BE BEHALF OF 29 KNOWN AS THE "CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR". SUCH MEDAL MAY BE AWARDED TO ANY PERSON WHO WAS A CITIZEN OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK (A) AT THE TIME OF THE 30 PRESENTATION OF SUCH MEDAL OR (B) AT THE TIME OF THE ACT OR ACTS GIVING 31 32 THE BASIS FOR WHICH SUCH MEDAL IS BEING AWARDED. THE CIVILIAN RISE то 33 MEDAL OF VALOR MAY BE AWARDED TO PERSONS WHO PERFORM A CONSPICUOUS AND 34 UNSELFISH ACT OR ACTS OF VALOR, HEROISM OR COURAGE IN ASSISTING ANY 35 OTHER PERSON OR PERSONS. CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR 36 SHALL, UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF ONE MEMBER OF THE ASSEMBLY AND ONE 37 SENATOR, BE CONSIDERED FOR SUCH AWARD BY THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR 38 COMMITTEE, ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION. 39 FURTHERMORE, SUCH COMMITTEE SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE SUITABLE DESIGN AND 40 INSCRIPTION OF THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR.

HEREBY CREATED, WITHIN THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT, A 41 THERE IS 2. (A) CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR COMMITTEE WHICH SHALL BE PERPETUAL 42 INDURATION 43 BE COMPOSED OF NINE MEMBERS. THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE AND 44 APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS: THREE MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, 45 TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, 46 MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, ONE TWO 47 MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE AND ONE 48 MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY. THE 49 MEMBERSHIP OF SUCH COMMITTEE SHALL REPRESENT THE BROAD SPECTRUM OF THE 50 THIS STATE, EXCEPT THAT LESS THAN ONE-HALF OF THE MEMBERS CITIZENRY OF 51 OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES OR IN THE ORGANIZED MILITIA OF THE STATE. THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE 52 SHALL A TERM OF THREE YEARS, EXCEPT THAT THE INITIAL APPOINTEES SHALL 53 SERVE 54 SERVE THE FOLLOWING TERMS: ONE MEMBER APPOINTED ΒY THE GOVERNOR, ONE 55 MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND ONE MEMBER 56 APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY SHALL SERVE A TERM OF ONE YEAR;

ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE TEMPO-1 RARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND ONE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF 2 THE ASSEMBLY SHALL SERVE A TERM OF TWO YEARS; AND ONE MEMBER APPOINTED 3 BY THE GOVERNOR, THE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE 4 5 SENATE AND THE MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY SHALL SERVE A TERM OF THREE YEARS. THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL 6 7 SERVE UNTIL THEIR SUCCESSORS HAVE BEEN APPOINTED AND HAVE OUALIFIED. EVERY VACANCY OCCURRING IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE FILLED FOR THE UNEXPIRED TERM OF THE VACANT MEMBER IN THE MANNER 8 9 10 PROVIDED FOR THE ORIGINAL APPOINTMENT OF SUCH MEMBER. THE CHAIR AND SECRETARY OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE ELECTED FROM AMONG THE MEMBERSHIP OF 11 SUCH COMMITTEE BY A MAJORITY VOTE THEREOF. 12

(B) THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR COMMITTEE SHALL MEET NOT LESS THAN 13 14 ONCE ANNUALLY, AND AT SUCH TIMES AS THE CHAIR, SECRETARY OR ANY THREE MEMBERS SHALL DESIGNATE. THE COMMITTEE UPON CONVENING A MEETING SHALL 15 16 REVIEW ALL CANDIDATES FOR THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR RECOMMENDED NOT LESS THAN THIRTY DAYS PRIOR TO SUCH MEETING. THE COMMITTEE SHALL ADOPT 17 ALL RULES PROVIDING FOR ITS PROCEDURES AND THE SPECIFIC OUALIFICATIONS 18 19 FOR THE AWARDING OF THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR. UPON THE AFFIRMATIVE 20 VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE, A CANDIDATE SHALL BE AWARDED THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR. SUCH MEDAL SHALL BE PRESENTED BY 21 THE GOVERNOR, OR, IN THE ALTERNATIVE, BY THE SENATOR AND MEMBER OF THE 22 ASSEMBLY REPRESENTING THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY DISTRICTS IN WHICH THE 23 24 MEDAL RECIPIENT RESIDES.

(C) THE MEMBERS OF THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR COMMITTEE SHALL RECEIVE
NO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES, BUT SHALL BE ALLOWED THEIR ACTUAL
AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES
PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

29 S 3. The state finance law is amended by adding a new section 89-i to 30 read as follows:

31 S 89-I. CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR FUND. 1. THERE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED 32 IN THE JOINT CUSTODY OF THE COMMISSIONER OF TAXATION AND FINANCE AND THE 33 COMPTROLLER, A SPECIAL FUND TO BE KNOWN AS THE "CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR 34 FUND".

THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR FUND SHALL CONSIST OF ALL GRANTS,
 BEQUESTS, DONATIONS AND ALL OTHER MONEYS APPROPRIATED, CREDITED, GIVEN
 OR TRANSFERRED THERETO FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE OR FUND.

38 3. THE MONEYS IN THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR FUND SHALL BE KEPT SEPA-39 RATE AND APART, AND SHALL NOT BE COMMINGLED WITH ANY OTHER MONEYS IN THE 40 CUSTODY OF THE COMMISSIONER OF TAXATION AND FINANCE OR THE COMPTROLLER, 41 AND SHALL ONLY BE EXPENDED AS PROVIDED BY SUBDIVISION FOUR OF THIS 42 SECTION.

43 4. THE MONEYS IN THE CIVILIAN MEDAL OF VALOR FUND SHALL BE EXPENDED 44 PURSUANT TO APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF IMPLEMENTING THE 45 PROVISIONS OF SECTION TEN OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW.

46 S 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
