- AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to employee human trafficking recognition training; and relating to authorizing the establishment of a standardized human trafficking recognition training program

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 2 210 to read as follows:

3 S 210. HUMAN-TRAFFICKING RECOGNITION TRAINING. ANY ESTABLISHMENT THAT 4 A GAMING FACILITY AS DEFINED BY SUBDIVISION TWENTY-THREE OF CONSTITUTES 5 SECTION THIRTEEN HUNDRED ONE OF THE RACING, PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING AND 6 BREEDING LAW, SHALL REQUIRE ALL EMPLOYEES TO UNDERGO A HUMAN-TRAFFICKING 7 RECOGNITION TRAINING PROGRAM ESTABLISHED BY THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL 8 JUSTICE SERVICES AND THE OFFICE OF TEMPORARY AND DISABILITY ASSISTANCE 9 CONSULTATION WITH THE NEW YORK STATE INTERAGENCY TASK FORCE ON HUMAN ΤN 10 TRAFFICKING. HOWEVER, FOR CLASS III GAMING ESTABLISHMENTS AUTHORIZED INDIAN GAMING REGULATORY ACT, 25 U.S.C. S 2701, ET SEQ., THE 11 UNDER THE GAMING COMMISSION SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE, UPON REQUEST, 12 SUCH HUMAN-TRAF-13 FICKING RECOGNITION TRAINING PROGRAM.

14 In consultation with the New York Interagency Task Force on S 2. 15 Human Trafficking, the commissioner of the division of criminal justice services and the commissioner of the office of temporary and disability 16 17 assistance shall together establish a standardized human-trafficking recognition training program for employees of gaming facilities. The 18 19 commissioners may use federal, state, and non-profit organization sourc-20 es provided that such training program shall address no less than the 21 following issues:

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- (a) The nature of human trafficking;
- (b) How human trafficking is defined in law;
- (c) How to identify victims of human trafficking; 3
 - (d) Relief and recovery options for survivors; and

(e) Social and legal services available to victims. The commissioner of the division of criminal justice services and the 6 commissioner of the office of temporary and disability assistance shall 7 complete the human-trafficking recognition training program and make it 8 available for use no more than six months after the effective date of 9 10 this act.

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S 3. This act shall take effect immediately. 11
