AN ACT to amend the executive law and the state finance law, in relation to minority and women-owned business enterprises post completion certification, duties of the director and creating the minority and women-owned business enterprise fund

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 314-a
2 to read as follows:

3 S 314-A. POST COMPLETION CERTIFICATION. THE DIRECTOR, IN COLLABORATION
4 WITH THE DIVISION OF MINORITY AND WOMEN'S BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND THE
5 DEPARTMENT OF SMALL BUSINESS SERVICES, SHALL DEVELOP THE FOLLOWING
6 STANDARDIZED CERTIFICATION FORMS THAT MUST BE COMPLETED UNDER PENALTY OF
7 PERJURY PRIOR TO THE PRIME CONTRACTOR BEING PAID:

8 1. CERTIFICATION FROM A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE PRIME CONTRACTOR THAT
9 THE MINORITY OR WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE IN FACT PERFORMED THE

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets

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1 SERVICES OR PROVIDED THE MATERIALS THAT THEY WERE CONTRACTED TO PERFORM
2 OR PROVIDE; AND

3 2. CERTIFICATION FROM A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MINORITY OR WOMEN-OWNED
4 BUSINESS ENTERPRISE THAT THEY IN FACT PERFORMED THE SERVICES OR PROVIDED
5 THE MATERIALS THAT THEY WERE CONTRACTED TO PERFORM OR PROVIDE.

6 S 2. Paragraphs (f), (h) and (i) of subdivision 3 of section 311 of
7 the executive law, paragraph (f) as added by chapter 261 of the laws of
8 1988, paragraph (h) as amended and paragraph (i) as added by section 1
9 of part BB of chapter 59 of the laws of 2006, are amended and three new
10 paragraphs (j), (k) and (l) are added to read as follows:

11 (f) to prepare and update periodically a directory of certified minor-
12 ity and women-owned business enterprises which shall, wherever practica-
13 ble, be divided into categories of labor, services, supplies, equipment,
14 materials and recognized construction trades and which shall indicate
15 areas or locations of the state where such enterprises are available to
16 perform services, AND TO USE THIS INFORMATION TO CREATE AN INTERNET
17 BASED, SEARCHABLE, CENTRALIZED STATE REGISTRY DETAILING CERTIFICATIONS,
18 DENIALS, WAIVERS AND ALL DOCUMENTS SUBMITTED DURING THE LIFE OF THE
19 CONTRACT;

20 (h) notwithstanding the provisions of section two hundred ninety-six
21 of this chapter, to file a complaint pursuant to the provisions of
22 section two hundred ninety-seven of this chapter where the director has
23 knowledge that a contractor may have violated the provisions of para-
24 graph (a), (b) or (c) of subdivision one of section two hundred ninety-
25 six of this chapter where such violation is unrelated, separate or
26 distinct from the state contract as expressed by its terms; [and]

27 (i) to streamline the state certification process to accept federal
28 and municipal corporation certifications[.];

29 (J) TO PERFORM INSPECTIONS OF MINORITY OR WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS'S PLACE
30 OF BUSINESS, WAREHOUSE OR STORAGE FACILITY TO CONFIRM THE EXISTENCE OF A
31 WORKFORCE, EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES;

32 (K) TO PERFORM INSPECTIONS OF FINANCIAL RECORDS OF MINORITY OR WOMEN-
33 OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES TO ENSURE SUCH ENTERPRISES ARE IN COMPLIANCE
34 WITH APPLICABLE LAWS; AND

35 (L) TO ENSURE THE PROTECTION OF INDIVIDUALS WHO REPORT SUSPECTED
36 VIOLATIONS OF THIS ARTICLE AND APPLICABLE LAWS RELATED TO MINORITY AND
37 WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES.

38 S 3. Subdivision 1 of section 314 of the executive law, as added by
39 chapter 261 of the laws of 1988, is amended to read as follows:

40 1. The director shall promulgate rules and regulations providing for
41 the establishment of a statewide certification program including rules
42 and regulations governing the approval, denial or revocation of any such
43 certification, INCLUDING REVOCATIONS FOR FELONY CONVICTIONS FOR FRAUDU-
44 LENTLY MISREPRESENTING THE STATUS OF MINORITY OR WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS
45 ENTERPRISES. Such rules and regulations shall include, but not be
46 limited to, such matters as may be required to ensure that the estab-
47 lished procedures thereunder shall at least be in compliance with the
48 code of fair procedure set forth in section seventy-three of the civil
49 rights law, AND CONSISTENT WITH THE PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE TWENTY-THREE-A
50 OF THE CORRECTION LAW.

51 S 4. Section 316 of the executive law, as amended by chapter 175 of
52 the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:

53 S 316. Enforcement. 1. Upon receipt by the director of a complaint by
54 a contracting agency that a contractor has violated the provisions of a
55 state contract which have been included to comply with the provisions of
56 this article or of a contractor that a contracting agency has violated

1 such provisions or has failed or refused to issue a waiver where one has
2 been applied for pursuant to subdivision six of section three hundred
3 thirteen of this article or has denied such application, the director
4 shall attempt to resolve the matter giving rise to such complaint. If
5 efforts to resolve such matter to the satisfaction of all parties are
6 unsuccessful, the director shall refer the matter, within thirty days of
7 the receipt of the complaint, to the division's hearing officers. Upon
8 conclusion of the administrative hearing, the hearing officer shall
9 submit to the director his or her decision regarding the alleged
10 violation of the contract and recommendations regarding the imposition
11 of sanctions, fines or penalties. The director, within ten days of
12 receipt of the decision, shall file a determination of such matter and
13 shall cause a copy of such determination along with a copy of this arti-
14 cle to be served upon the contractor by personal service or by certified
15 mail return receipt requested. The decision of the hearing officer shall
16 be final and may only be vacated or modified as provided in article
17 seventy-eight of the civil practice law and rules upon an application
18 made within the time provided by such article. The determination of the
19 director as to the imposition of any fines, sanctions or penalties shall
20 be reviewable pursuant to article seventy-eight of the civil practice
21 law and rules. The penalties imposed for any violation which is premised
22 upon either a fraudulent or intentional misrepresentation by the
23 contractor or the contractor's willful and intentional disregard of the
24 minority and women-owned participation requirement included in the
25 contract may include a determination that the contractor shall be ineli-
26 gible to submit a bid to any contracting agency or be awarded any such
27 contract for a period not to exceed one year following the final deter-
28 mination; provided however, if a contractor has previously been deter-
29 mined to be ineligible to submit a bid pursuant to this section, the
30 penalties imposed for any subsequent violation, if such violation occurs
31 within five years of the first violation, may include a determination
32 that the contractor shall be ineligible to submit a bid to any contract-
33 ing agency or be awarded any such contract for a period not to exceed
34 five years following the final determination. The division of minority
35 and women's business development shall maintain a website listing all
36 contractors that have been deemed ineligible to submit a bid pursuant to
37 this section and the date after which each contractor shall once again
38 become eligible to submit bids.

39 2. ANY FINES, OR PORTION THEREOF, IMPOSED PURSUANT TO THE FOREGOING
40 SUBDIVISION, OR IMPOSED BY A COURT OF COMPETENT JURISDICTION RELATED TO
41 CONVICTIONS INVOLVING FRAUD RELATED TO THIS ARTICLE OR OTHERWISE INVOLV-
42 ING A MINORITY OR WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE, MAY BE REQUIRED BY
43 THE ENTITY IMPOSING SUCH FINES TO BE PAID TO THE MINORITY AND
44 WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE FUND ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION
45 NINETY-SEVEN-J OF THE STATE FINANCE LAW.

46 S 5. The state finance law is amended by adding a new section 97-j to
47 read as follows:

48 S 97-J. MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE FUND. 1. THERE IS
49 HEREBY ESTABLISHED IN THE JOINT CUSTODY OF THE STATE COMPTROLLER AND THE
50 COMMISSIONER OF TAXATION AND FINANCE A SPECIAL FUND TO BE KNOWN AS THE
51 "MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE FUND".

52 2. SUCH FUNDS SHALL CONSIST OF ALL MONEYS APPROPRIATED FOR THE PURPOSE
53 OF SUCH FUND, ALL MONEYS TRANSFERRED OR PAID TO SUCH FUND PURSUANT TO
54 LAW, INCLUDING PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE HUNDRED SIXTEEN OF THE EXECU-
55 TIVE LAW, AND CONTRIBUTIONS CONSISTING OF GRANTS, INCLUDING GRANTS OR
56 OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM ANY AGENCY OF GOVERNMENT AND ALL MONEYS

1 REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION OR ANY OTHER LAW TO BE PAID
2 INTO OR CREDITED TO THIS FUND.

3 3. MONIES OF THE FUND, FOLLOWING APPROPRIATION BY THE LEGISLATURE,
4 SHALL BE EXPENDED TO ACQUIRE SOFTWARE, EMPLOY PERSONNEL TO AUDIT, INVES-
5 TIGATE AND PROSECUTE MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE FRAUD
6 AND TO UNDERWRITE MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAMS
7 TO ASSIST MINORITY AND WOMEN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE OWNERS TO DEVELOP
8 SUSTAINABLE BUSINESSES.

9 S 6. This act shall take effect immediately, provided, however, that
10 the amendments to article 15-A of the executive law made by sections
11 one, two, three, and four of this act shall not affect the expiration of
12 such article and shall be deemed to expire therewith.
