AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to granting the attorney general jurisdiction to investigate and prosecute police misconduct

PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 63 of the executive law is amended by adding a new 1 2 subdivision 17 to read as follows:

INVESTIGATE THEALLEGED COMMISSION OF ANY CRIMINAL OFFENSE OR OFFENSES COMMITTED BY A POLICE OFFICER IN CONNECTION WITH THE ANCE OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL DUTIES, AND PROSECUTE ANY SUCH PERSON OR PERSONS BELIEVED TO HAVE COMMITTED SUCH CRIMINAL OFFENSE OR OFFENSES CONNECTION WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF HIS OR HER OFFICIAL DUTIES. ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY ONLY EXERCISE THE JURISDICTION PROVIDED SUBDIVISION UPON A WRITTEN FINDING THAT SUCH JURISDICTION IS NECESSARY BECAUSE: (A) OF A LACK OF ALTERNATIVE PROSECUTORIAL RESOURCES INVESTIGATE AND PROSECUTE SUCH CRIMINAL OFFENSE OR OFFENSES ADEOUATELY OR, (B) THE EXERCISE OF SUCH JURISDICTION IS NECESSARY TO ENSURE CONFIDENCE OF THEPUBLIC IN THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM. IN ALL SUCH PROCEEDINGS, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY APPEAR IN PERSON OR BY HIS OR HER DEPUTY OR ASSISTANT BEFORE ANY COURT OR GRAND JURY AND EXERCISE ALL OF THE POWERS AND PERFORM ALL OF THE DUTIES WITH RESPECT TO SUCH ACTIONS OR
