AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to designating Little Wolf and Simon as inland waterways for purposes of waterfront revitalization

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Subdivision 4 of section 911 of the executive law, as amended by chapter 133 of the laws of 2012, paragraph (a) as separately amended by chapters 92 and 97 of the laws of 2015, paragraph (b) as separately amended by chapters 95, 96 and 97 of the laws of 2015, paragraph (c) as amended by chapter 98 of the laws of 2015, is amended to read as follows:
- 4. "Inland waterways" shall mean (a) the state's major inland lakes consisting of lakes Ballston, Big Tupper, Black, Campfire, Canadarago, Canandaigua, Cayuga, Champlain, Chateaugay, Chautauqua, Conesus, Cranberry, Echo (in the county of Westchester), George, Great Sacandaga, Honeoye, Indian, Keuka, LITTLE WOLF (IN THE COUNTY OF FRANKLIN), Long, Mirror, Oneida, Onondaga, Otisco, Otsego, Owasco, Peach, Placid, Raquette, Ronkonkoma, Sacandaga, Saratoga, Schroon, Seneca, Skaneateles, Silver (in the county of Wyoming) and Saranac, SIMON (IN THE COUNTY OF FRANKLIN) and the Fulton chain of lakes; (b) the state's major rivers comprised of the Allegheny, Ausable, Battenkill, Black, Boquet, Bronx, Canisteo, Chaumont (including Chaumont bay), Chemung, Cohocton, Delaware, Deer, Genesee, Grasse, Great Chazy, Hoosic, Hudson north of the federal dam at Troy, Indian, Little (in the Adirondack park), Little

Ausable, Little Salmon (including north and south branches), Mettowee, Mohawk, Oswegatchie, Pocantico, Racquette, Sacandaga, Salmon, Saranac, Saw Mill, Schroon, Susquehanna, Tioga, Tioughnioga, Wallkill and Buffalo rivers, and the north and middle branches of the Moose river; (c) the state's major creeks comprised of the 18 Mile Creek located in Erie county, Bushkill, Cattaraugus, Cincinnati, East Kill, 5 6 7 Esopus (including upper and lower branches), Fish (including east and west branches), Gooseberry, Little Sandy, Onondaga, Sandy, Schoharie, South Sandy, Oatka, Tonawanda, West Kill, Scajaquada, Wappinger and 8 9 10 Wynantskill; (d) the Barge Canal System as defined in section two of the law; and (e) the adjacent shorelands to the extent that such 11 inland waters and adjacent lands are strongly influenced by each other 12 including, but not limited to, islands, wetlands, beaches, dunes, barri-13 er islands, cliffs, bluffs and erosion prone areas. 14 15
