Introduced by Sen. HANNON -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Local Government -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to authorize the assessor of the county of Nassau to accept an application from real property taxes from Strong Youth, Inc. for a certain parcel in the town of Hempstead

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,
2 the assessor of the county of Nassau is hereby authorized to accept from
3 Strong Youth, Inc. an application for exemption from real property taxes
4 pursuant to section 420-a of the real property tax law for a portion of
5 the 2013-2014 assessment roll and a portion of the 2014-2015 assessment
6 roll for the parcel located in the town of Hempstead at 599 Jerusalem
7 Avenue, Uniondale, otherwise known as: section 34, block 79, lots 86
8 and 92.
9 If accepted, such application shall be reviewed as if it had been
10 received on or before the taxable status dates established for such
11 rolls. If satisfied that such non-profit would otherwise be entitled to
12 such exemption if such non-profit had filed an application for exemption
13 by the appropriate taxable status dates, the assessor, upon approval of
14 the Nassau county legislature, may grant exemption from all taxation and
15 make appropriate corrections to the subject rolls. If such exemption is
16 granted and such non-profit therefore shall have paid any tax with
17 respect to the subject rolls, the governing body or tax department may,
18 in its sole discretion, provide for the refund of those taxes paid and
19 cancel any taxes, fines, penalties, interest or tax liens remaining
20 unpaid.
21 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
