AN ACT to amend chapter 522 of the laws of 2000, amending the state finance law and the general business law relating to establishing the underground facilities safety training account, in relation to extending provisions of law relating to the underground facilities safety training account; and to amend the general business law, in relation to protection of underground utility facilities

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Section 4 of chapter 522 of the laws of 2000, amending the state finance law and the general business law relating to establishing the underground facilities safety training account, as amended by chapter 372 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 S 4. This act shall take effect thirty days after it shall have become 6 a law and shall expire and be deemed repealed October 1, [2015] 2020.
 - S 2. Section 762 of the general business law, as amended by chapter 685 of the laws of 1994, is amended to read as follows:
 - S 762. Duties of local governing bodies AND MUNICIPALITIES. The local governing bodies shall display in an appropriate location and provide a notice to each applicant for an excavation and demolition permit that informs them about their responsibilities under the law and regulations to protect underground facilities and the existence, operation and
- 13 to protect underground facilities and the existence, operation and 14 programs of the one-call notification system. ANY MUNICIPALITY WHICH
- 15 CONTRACTS FOR EXCAVATION OF UNDERGROUND FACILITIES SHALL REQUIRE THE 16 EXCAVATOR TO HAVE COMPLETED THE TRAINING AND EDUCATION PROGRAM PROVIDED
- 17 BY THE ONE-CALL NOTIFICATION SYSTEM PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE.
- 18 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
