AN ACT to amend the public health law and the education law, in relation to providing for the use of opioid antagonists in schools for opioid overdose prevention

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 3 of section 3309 of the public health law, as added by chapter 42 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:

- (iv) "Opioid antagonist recipient" or "recipient" means a person at risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose, or a family member, friend or other person in a position to assist a person experiencing or at risk of experiencing an opioid-related overdose, or an organization registered as an opioid overdose prevention program pursuant to this section, OR A SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES, COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD, CHARTER SCHOOL, NON-PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND/OR SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THE STATE OR ANY PERSON EMPLOYED BY SUCH DISTRICT, BOARD OR SCHOOL.
- S 2. Subdivision 4 of section 3309 of the public health law, as amended by chapter 42 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:
- 16 4. Use of an opioid antagonist pursuant to this section shall be 17 considered first aid or emergency treatment for the purpose of any stat-18 ute relating to liability.
- A recipient, opioid overdose prevention program, SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES, COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD, CHARTER SCHOOL, NON-PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND/OR SECONDARY SCHOOL IN THE STATE, OR ANY PERSON EMPLOYED BY SUCH DISTRICT, BOARD OR SCHOOL under this section, acting reasonably and in good faith

- S 3. Subdivision 3 of section 3309 of the public health law, as added by chapter 34 of the laws of 2014, is renumbered subdivision 3-a.
- 5 S 4. The education law is amended by adding a new section 922 to read 6 as follows:
  - S 922. OPIOID OVERDOSE PREVENTION. 1. SCHOOL DISTRICTS, BOARDS OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES, COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARDS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND NON-PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THIS STATE MAY PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN ON-SITE IN EACH INSTRUCTIONAL SCHOOL FACILITY OPIOID ANTAGONISTS, AS DEFINED IN SECTION THREE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED NINE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, IN QUANTITIES AND TYPES DEEMED BY THE COMMISSIONER, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH, TO BE ADEQUATE TO ENSURE READY AND APPROPRIATE ACCESS FOR USE DURING EMERGENCIES TO ANY STUDENT OR STAFF HAVING OPIOID OVERDOSE WHETHER OR NOT THERE IS A PREVIOUS HISTORY OF OPIOID ABUSE.

SCHOOL DISTRICTS, BOARDS OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES, COUN-TY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARDS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND NON-18 19 PUBLIC ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THIS STATE OR ANY PERSON EMPLOYED BY ANY SUCH ENTITY MAY ADMINISTER AN OPIOID ANTAGONIST IN THE 20 21 EVENT OF AN EMERGENCY PURSUANT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION THREE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED NINE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW. 22
- 23 S 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
