AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to annual reports concerning veteran-owned small businesses

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Section 353 of the executive law is amended by adding a new subdivision 22 to read as follows:
 - 22. TO INCLUDE WITHIN THE ANNUAL REPORT AS REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION ELEVEN OF THIS SECTION AN ACCOUNTING OF THE NUMBER OF VETERAN-OWNED SMALL BUSINESSES IN THE STATE OF NEW YORK, TO BE LISTED BY THE FOLLOWING
- 6 DESIGNATIONS: SMALL BUSINESS CONCERN OWNED AND CONTROLLED BY VETERANS AS 7 SET FORTH IN 15 U.S.C. SECTION 632(Q)(3), AS AMENDED FROM TIME TO TIME,
- 8 AND SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE AS SET FORTH IN
- 9 ARTICLE SEVENTEEN-B OF THIS CHAPTER. SUCH LISTING SHALL INCLUDE BUT NOT
- 10 BE LIMITED TO THE NAME OF THE VETERAN OWNER OR OWNERS OF EACH BUSINESS,
- 11 LOCATION OF EACH SUCH BUSINESS, THE TYPE OF EACH SUCH BUSINESS AND WHEN-12 EVER PRACTICABLE, BE DIVIDED INTO CATEGORIES OF LABOR, SERVICES. EOUIP-
- 12 EVER PRACTICABLE, BE DIVIDED INTO CATEGORIES OF LABOR, SERVICES, EQUIP-13 MENT, MATERIALS AND RECOGNIZED CONSTRUCTION TRADES. THE DIVISION SHALL
- 14 REQUEST THIS INFORMATION ANNUALLY FROM THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS
- 15 AFFAIRS, ANY OTHER APPROPRIATE FEDERAL AGENCIES AND THE DIVISION OF 16 SERVICE-DISABLED VETERANS' BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE NEW YORK
- 17 STATE OFFICE OF GENERAL SERVICES.
- 18 S 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall
- 19 have become a law.
