AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to fire drills and lock-down and shelter in place drills

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The section heading of section 807 of the education law, as amended by chapter 765 of the laws of 1964, is amended to read as follows:

Fire, SHELTER IN PLACE AND LOCKDOWN drills.

- S 2. Subdivision 1 of section 807 of the education law, as amended by chapter 143 of the laws of 1985, is amended and a new subdivision 1-b is added to read as follows:
- 7 8 1. It shall be the duty of the principal or other person in charge of 9 every public or private school or educational institution within the 10 state, other than colleges or universities, to instruct and train the 11 pupils by means of drills, so that they may in a sudden emergency be able to leave the school building in the shortest possible time and 12 without confusion or panic. Such drills or rapid dismissals shall be 13 14 held at least [twelve] EIGHT times in each school year, [eight] which required drills shall be held between September first and December 15 16 first of each such year. At least one-third of all such required drills shall be through use of the fire escapes on buildings where fire escapes 17 are provided. In the course of at least one such drill, pupils shall 18 19 instructed in the procedure to be followed in the event that a fire 20 occurs during lunch period, provided however, that such additional instruction may be waived where a drill is held during the regular 21 22 school lunch period. At least [four] TWO additional drills shall be held in each school year during the hours after sunset and before sunrise in 23 school buildings in which students are provided with sleeping accommo-24 25 At least two additional drills shall be held during summer dations. school in buildings where summer school is conducted, and one of such 27 drills shall be held during the first week of summer school.

1-B. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE PRINCIPAL OR OTHER PERSON IN CHARGE OF EVERY PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SCHOOL OR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION WITHIN THE STATE, OTHER THAN COLLEGES OR UNIVERSITIES, TO INSTRUCT AND TRAIN PUPILS BY MEANS OF DRILLS, SO THAT THEY MAY KNOW THE APPROPRIATE ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN IN AN EMERGENCY REQUIRING THEM TO REMAIN INSIDE OF A SCHOOL BUILD-ING. SUCH LOCKDOWN DRILLS SHALL BE HELD AT LEAST TWO TIMES IN EACH SCHOOL YEAR, ONE DRILL SHALL BE HELD BETWEEN SEPTEMBER FIRST AND DECEM-7 BER FIRST OF EACH SUCH SCHOOL YEAR, AND AT LEAST ONE SUCH ADDITIONAL DRILL SHALL BE HELD DURING THE FIRST WEEK OF SUMMER SCHOOL. SUCH SHEL-9 10 TER IN PLACE DRILLS SHALL BE HELD AT LEAST TWO TIMES IN EACH SCHOOL YEAR, ONE SUCH DRILL SHALL BE HELD BETWEEN SEPTEMBER FIRST AND DECEMBER 11 FIRST OF EACH SUCH SCHOOL YEAR AND AT LEAST ONE SUCH ADDITIONAL DRILL 12 SHALL BE HELD DURING THE FIRST WEEK OF SUMMER SCHOOL. 13

14 S 3. This act shall take effect on the first of July next succeeding 15 the date on which it shall have become a law.
