AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to pygmy pigs

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Section 206 of the public health law is amended by adding a 2 new subdivision 30 to read as follows:
- 30. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PROMULGATE ANY NECESSARY RULES AND REGU-4 LATIONS PERMITTING MUNICIPALITIES TO ALLOW PYGMY PIGS AS PETS. FOR THE 5 PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE TERM "PYGMY PIG" MEANS A PIG OR HOG 6 CLASSIFIED AS SUS SCROFA JUBATUS MULLER, OR SUS SCROFA (CRISTATUS) 7 VITTATUS, AND COMMONLY REFERRED TO AS A VIETNAMESE POT-BELLIED PIG, 8 PYGMY PIG OR MINI-PIG, WHICH STANDS NO HIGHER THAN TWENTY-TWO INCHES AT 9 THE SHOULDER AND WEIGHS NO MORE THAN TWO HUNDRED POUNDS.
- 10 S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 11 it shall have become a law.
