AN ACT to amend the public health law and the education law, in relation to authorizing emergency medical service personnel to provide certain emergency medical care to cats and dogs under certain circumstances

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 3013 of the public health law is amended by adding two new subdivisions 7 and 8 to read as follows:

CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN, OR ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN ACTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION THOUSAND EIGHTEEN OF THIS ARTICLE, NOR ANY AMBULANCE SERVICE OR ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT FIRST RESPONSE SERVICE OF WHICH SUCH PERSON MEMBER OR EMPLOYEE, WHO RENDERS EMERGENCY MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO A DOG OR CAT PURSUANT TO SUCH SECTION, SHALL HAVE ANY CIVIL OR CRIMINAL LIABILITY ANY LIABILITY FOR VIOLATING ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE OF THE EDUCATION LAW, FOR THE PROVISION OF SUCH CARE, OR ANY DAMAGES TO DEATH OF ANY DOG OR CAT ALLEGED TO HAVE OCCURRED BY REASON OF AN ACT OR OMISSION IN RENDERING SUCH MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN AN EMERGENCY UNLESS IS ESTABLISHED THAT SUCH INJURIES WERE OR SUCH DEATH WAS CAUSED BY GROSS SUCH CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMERGENCY NEGLIGENCE onTHEPART OF MEDICAL TECHNICIAN OR ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN AS AND REGULATIONS OF THE STATE BOARD FOR VETERINARY MINED BY THE RULES MEDICINE ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION TWO OF SECTION SIXTY-SEVEN THREE OF THE EDUCATION LAW AND ANY OFF-SITE INSTRUCTIONS OF A VETERINARIAN PROVIDING SUPERVISION DURING SUCH EMERGENCY.

NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, ANY VETERINA-RIAN WHO PROVIDES OFF-SITE INSTRUCTION, PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE OF THIS ARTICLE, TO ANY CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMER-SAND EIGHTEEN TECHNICIAN OR ADVANCED EMERGENCY GENCY MEDICAL MEDICAL TECHNICIAN PROVIDING EMERGENCY MEDICAL ASSISTANCE TO A DOG OR CAT SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR DAMAGES FOR INJURIES OR DEATH ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN ANY DOG OR CAT AS A RESULT OF SUCH INSTRUCTION UNLESS IT IS ESTAB-

- S 2. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 3018 to read as follows:
- 5 S 3018. EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE TO DOGS AND CATS. 1. IN COURSE 6 EMERGENCY, A CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMERGENCY RESPONDING TO ANY 7 MEDICAL TECHNICIAN OR ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN MAY, ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE STATE BOARD FOR VETERI-9 MEDICINE, PROVIDE EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE TO A DOG OR CAT PRIOR TO 10 THE TRANSFER OF SUCH ANIMAL TO THE CARE OF A VETERINARIAN. THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE TO CATS AND DOGS PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL BE 11 12 FOLLOWING, IF THE CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN OR ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN IS ABLE AND AUTHOR-13 14 IZED TO PROVIDE SUCH CARE TO A HUMAN:
 - (A) OPENING AND MANUALLY MAINTAINING AN AIRWAY;
 - (B) PROVIDING MOUTH TO MOUTH OR MOUTH TO BARRIER VENTILATION;
 - (C) ADMINISTERING OXYGEN;
 - (D) MANAGING VENTILATION BY MASK;
 - (E) CONTROLLING HEMORRHAGE WITH DIRECT PRESSURE;
 - (F) IMMOBILIZING FRACTURES;
 - (G) BANDAGING; AND

- 22 (H) ADMINISTERING NALOXONE HYDROCHLORIDE TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED BY 23 LAW, RULE OR REGULATION AND AS DIRECTED BY A VETERINARIAN.
 - 2. TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, EACH CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN, DURING THE COURSE OF PROVIDING EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE TO A DOG OR CAT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, SHALL COMMUNICATE WITH A VETERINARIAN FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSULTING UPON THE PROVISION OF SUCH CARE.
 - 3. THE STATE BOARD FOR VETERINARY MEDICINE SHALL PROMULGATE SUCH RULES AND REGULATIONS AS SHALL BE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
 - S 3. Section 6701 of the education law, as amended by chapter 268 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:
 - S 6701. Definition of practice of veterinary medicine. The practice of the profession of veterinary medicine is defined as diagnosing, treating, operating, or prescribing for any animal disease, pain, injury, deformity or dental or physical condition, or the subcutaneous insertion of a microchip intended to be used to identify an animal, OR THE PROVISION OF INSTRUCTION TO ANY CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN OR ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN PROVIDING EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE TO A DOG OR CAT PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE THOU-SAND EIGHTEEN OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW. "Animal" includes every living creature except a human being. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, no provisions of this section shall be construed to include the floating of equine teeth as being within the practice of veterinary medicine.
 - S 4. The opening paragraph of section 6703 of the education law is designated subdivision 1 and a new subdivision 2 is added to read as follows:
 - 2. THE STATE BOARD FOR VETERINARY MEDICINE SHALL PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE PROVISION OF EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE TO DOGS AND CATS BY EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE PERSONNEL PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE THOUSAND EIGHTEEN OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW.
- 54 S 5. Section 6705 of the education law is amended by adding a new 55 subdivision 16 to read as follows:

1 2 3 16. A CERTIFIED FIRST RESPONDER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN OR ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN TO THE EXTENT AUTHORIZED BY SECTION THREE THOUSAND EIGHTEEN OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW.

S 6. This act shall take effect immediately, except that sections one, two, three and five of this act shall take effect on the first of Janu-6 ary next succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law.
