AN ACT to amend the public housing law and the real property law, in relation to discrimination against owners of specific breeds of dog

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The public housing law is amended by adding a new section 2 223-c to read as follows:

3 S 223-C. DISCRIMINATION AGAINST PERSONS WHO OWN CERTAIN BREEDS OF 4 DOGS. NO PERSON SHALL BE DENIED OCCUPANCY IN A DWELLING IN ANY PROJECT 5 OR BE SUBJECTED TO EVICTION FROM ANY SUCH DWELLING ON THE GROUNDS THAT б SUCH PERSON OWNS A SPECIFIC BREED OF DOG AND THE DOG RESIDES WITH SUCH 7 PERSON. NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO PROHIBIT THE IMPO-SITION OF REASONABLE RESTRICTIONS OR REQUIREMENTS ON THE 8 OWNERSHIP OF 9 DOGS, REGARDLESS OF THEIR BREED, OR OWNERSHIP OF DANGEROUS DOGS AS 10 DEFINED IN SECTION ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE OF THE AGRICULTURE AND 11 MARKETS LAW.

12 S 2. Article 7 of the real property law is amended by adding a new 13 section 238-a to read as follows:

S 238-A. DISCRIMINATION IN LEASES WITH RESPECT TO 14 SPECIFIC BREED OF 15 DOGS. NO PERSON, FIRM OR CORPORATION OWNING OR HAVING IN CHARGE ANY APARTMENT HOUSE, TENEMENT HOUSE OR OTHER BUILDING OR MOBILE 16 HOME PARK 17 USED FOR DWELLING PURPOSES SHALL RESTRICT A TENANT'S ABILITY TO OWN A BE CONSTRUED 18 SPECIFIC BREED OF DOG. NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL ΤO IMPOSITION OF REASONABLE RESTRICTIONS OR REQUIREMENTS ON 19 PROHIBIT THE 20 THE OWNERSHIP OF DOGS, REGARDLESS OF THEIR BREED, OR OWNERSHIP OF 21 DOGS AS DEFINED IN SECTION ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE OF THE DANGEROUS 22 AGRICULTURE AND MARKETS LAW.

23 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
