- AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to requiring the collection of certain demographic information by certain state agencies, boards and commissions

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Legislative intent. The legislature hereby finds and 2 declares the following:

3 (a) Asian Americans as well as Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders are an incredibly diverse group. Due to this diversity, the 4 5 United States Office of Management and Budget's Statistical Policy б Directive No. 15, entitled Race and Ethnic Standards for Federal Statis-7 tics and Administrative Reporting, separated the "Asian and Pacific 8 Islander" category into two distinct and separate categories, now called 9 and "Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders," and these "Asians" 10 two distinct categories were used in the 2000 United States Census. The 11 United States Census Bureau currently reports data for more than 20 12 different ethnicities within these two categories.

(b) While Asian Americans as well as Native Hawaiians and other Pacific Islanders are often misrepresented as a homogeneous group, they are an extremely diverse group, with ethnicities from over 30 different countries. Although Asian American as well as Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander communities in this state share geographical and cultural commonalities, they also experience diverse social, educa-

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tional, health, and economic differences that are unique to their 1 2 respective communities. 3 (c) Existing state law requires state demographic data to be collected 4 for Asian and some Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander ethnic groups. 5 However, additional ethnic groups reported by the United States Census 6 Bureau are not included that reflect changing demographics and intra-7 state migration patterns. Most state agencies are currently not in 8 compliance with existing state law or have not made the collected data accessible. Data should be updated on a regular basis and made accessi-9 10 ble to the public so that regional and local governments, elected officials, decision makers, and other stakeholders can use the information 11 12 to strategically target programs for those most in need. (d) Given the diversity of languages and cultures, separating data for 13 14 additional Asian and additional Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander 15 ethnic groups and making the data publicly accessible are critical for enhancing our state's understanding of the needs and experiences of 16 17 these different communities. 18 S 2. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 170-c to 19 read as follows: 20 170-C. COLLECTION OF DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION. 1. EVERY STATE AGEN-S 21 CY, BOARD, OR COMMISSION THAT DIRECTLY OR BY CONTRACT COLLECTS DEMO-22 TO THE ANCESTRY OR ETHNIC ORIGIN OF RESIDENTS OF THE GRAPHIC DATA AS 23 STATE OF NEW YORK SHALL USE SEPARATE COLLECTION CATEGORIES AND TABU-24 LATIONS FOR THE FOLLOWING: 25 MAJOR ASIAN GROUP, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, CHINESE, EACH (A) 26 JAPANESE, FILIPINO, KOREAN, VIETNAMESE, ASIAN INDIAN, LAOTIAN, CAMBODI-27 BANGLADESHI, HMONG, INDONESIAN, MALAYSIAN, PAKISTANI, SRI LANKAN, AN, 28 TAIWANESE, NEPALESE, BURMESE, TIBETAN, AND THAI; AND 29 (B) EACH MAJOR PACIFIC ISLANDER GROUP, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, 30 HAWAIIAN, GUAMANIAN, SAMOAN, FIJIAN AND TONGAN; OR (C) OTHER ASIAN OR PACIFIC ISLAND GROUP. 31 32 EVERY STATE AGENCY, BOARD, OR COMMISSION THAT DIRECTLY OR BY 2. 33 CONTRACT COLLECTS DEMOGRAPHIC DATA AS TO THE ANCESTRY OR ETHNIC ORIGIN 34 RESIDENTS OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK SHALL USE SEPARATE COLLECTION OF 35 CATEGORIES AND TABULATIONS FOR THE FOLLOWING: (A) THE PRIMARY LANGUAGE; AND 36 37 (B) THE PLACE OF BIRTH OR COUNTRY OF ORIGIN. 38 3. THE DATA COLLECTED PURSUANT TO THE DIFFERENT COLLECTION CATEGORIES 39 TABULATIONS DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION (A) SHALL BE INCLUDED IN EVERY AND 40 DEMOGRAPHIC REPORT ON ANCESTRY OR ETHNIC ORIGINS OF RESIDENTS OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK BY THE STATE AGENCY, BOARD, OR COMMISSION PUBLISHED OR 41 RELEASED ON OR AFTER JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SEVENTEEN. THE DATA SHALL 42 43 BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE AND FEDERAL EXCEPT FOR PERSONAL IDENTIFYING INFORMATION, WHICH SHALL BE DEEMED 44 LAW, 45 CONFIDENTIAL, BY POSTING THE DATA ON THE INTERNET WEB SITE OF THE AGENCY ON OR BEFORE JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SEVENTEEN, AND ANNUALLY 46 THEREAFT-47 SUBDIVISION SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUED TO PREVENT ANY OTHER STATE THIS ER. 48 AGENCY FROM POSTING DATA COLLECTED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION (A) ON THE 49 AGENCY'S INTERNET WEB SITE, IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THIS SECTION. 50 S 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 51 it shall have become a law.
