AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the empire engineers initiative act

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as "the empire 2 engineers initiative act".

3 S 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 679-g to 4 read as follows:

5 S 679-G. NEW YORK STATE ENGINEERS LOAN FORGIVENESS PROGRAM. 1. 6 PURPOSE. THE PRESIDENT SHALL GRANT STUDENT LOAN FORGIVENESS AWARDS FOR 7 THE PURPOSE OF INCREASING THE NUMBER OF ENGINEERS SERVING IN NEW YORK 8 CITY AND THE REST OF THE STATE.

9 ELIGIBILITY. TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR AN AWARD PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, 2. 10 APPLICANTS SHALL (A) HAVE RECEIVED A DEGREE IN ENGINEERING FROM AN ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY; (B) COMPLY WITH SUBDIVISIONS THREE AND 11 SECTION SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE OF 12 FIVE OF THIS PART; (C) HAVE AN 13 OUTSTANDING STUDENT LOAN DEBT; AND (D) ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH THE CORPORATION TO PERFORM ENGINEERING SERVICES WITHIN THE STATE. 14

15 3. AWARDS. THE CORPORATION SHALL GRANT AWARDS IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO FIFTY PERCENT OF THE TOTAL TUITION CHARGED TO THE STUDENT BY ALL SCHOOLS 16 OR FIFTY PERCENT OF THE TOTAL TUITION CHARGED TO A STATE 17 RESIDENT ATTENDING AN ENGINEERING PROGRAM AT THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW 18 STUDENT YORK, WHICHEVER IS LESS PRIOR TO THE APPLICATION OF ANY 19 SCHOLARSHIPS, 20 GRANTS, OR OTHER FINANCIAL AWARDS. AWARDS SHALL BE WITHIN THE AMOUNTS 21 APPROPRIATED FOR SUCH PURPOSE AND BASED ON AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS.

4. CONVERSION. THE CORPORATION SHALL CONVERT TO A STUDENT LOAN THE
 FULL AMOUNT OF THE AWARD GIVEN PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, PLUS INTEREST,
 ACCORDING TO A SCHEDULE TO BE DETERMINED BY THE CORPORATION IF: (A) AT
 ANY POINT IN THE FIVE YEAR PERIOD AFTER RECEIPT OF SUCH AWARD THE RECIP IENT IS NOT EMPLOYED AS AN ENGINEER LOCATED WITHIN NEW YORK STATE; OR
 (B) A RECIPIENT FAILS TO RESPOND TO REQUESTS BY THE CORPORATION REGARD ING HIS OR HER PROFESSIONAL STATUS.

5. RULES AND REGULATIONS. THE CORPORATION IS AUTHORIZED TO PROMULGATE 8 RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROVISIONS 9 10 OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDING A METHOD FOR DETERMINING THE PRIORITY IN WHICH AWARDS ARE DISTRIBUTED. WHEN DETERMINING RULES CONCERNING PRIORI-11 TY, THE CORPORATION SHALL TAKE SUCH ACTION TO ENSURE THAT THE INTENT OF 12 THIS SECTION IS FULFILLED, AND SHALL GIVE PREFERENCE TO INDIVIDUALS WHO 13 RECEIVED THEIR DEGREE FROM A NEW YORK BASED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY. 14 IN THE EVENT THAT THERE ARE MORE APPLICANTS WHO HAVE THE SAME PRIORITY THAN 15 THERE ARE REMAINING AWARDS, THE CORPORATION SHALL PROVIDE IN REGULATION 16 THE METHOD OF DISTRIBUTING THE REMAINING NUMBER OF SUCH AWARDS, WHICH 17 MAY INCLUDE A LOTTERY OR OTHER FORM OF RANDOM SELECTION. 18

19 S 3. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-20 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
