- AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to procedures engaged in by investigating peace or police officers responding to traffic accidents involving a pedestrian or bicyclist and an omnibus

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The vehicle and traffic law is amended by adding a new 2 section 600-a to read as follows:

3 S 600-A. ACCIDENTS INVOLVING PEDESTRIANS OR BICYCLISTS AND AN OMNIBUS. 4 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LOCAL LAW, ORDINANCE OR RULE, ANY PEACE OFFICER OR 5 POLICE OFFICER RESPONDING TO THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT INVOLVING A COLLI-SION BETWEEN AN OMNIBUS AND EITHER A PEDESTRIAN OR BICYCLE OPERATOR, WHO б 7 IS CONDUCTING AN INVESTIGATION AS TO THE CAUSE FOR SUCH COLLISION AND IS 8 RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COMPLETION OF AN ACCIDENT REPORT REOUIRED ΒY THIS ARTICLE, SHALL ISSUE A UNIFORM TRAFFIC CITATION FOR THE OMNIBUS OPERATOR 9 TO APPEAR IN A COURT HAVING COMPETENT JURISDICTION IF SUCH OFFICER HAS A 10 TO BELIEVE THAT A TRAFFIC INFRACTION OR MISDEMEANOR, 11 REASONABLE CAUSE 12 OTHER THAN A MISDEMEANOR DEFINED BY THIS CHAPTER, HAS BEEN COMMITTED BY 13 OMNIBUS OPERATOR. IF THE DRIVER OF THE OMNIBUS IS DULY LICENSED THE 14 UNDER ARTICLE NINETEEN-A OF THIS CHAPTER, HAS REMAINED AT THE SCENE OF SUCH ACCIDENT AND HAS COOPERATED WITH THE INVESTIGATING OFFICER, THEN 15 SUCH OFFICER SHALL NOT DETAIN OR OTHERWISE PREVENT SUCH OPERATOR FROM 16 THE SCENE OF SUCH ACCIDENT AFTER THE OFFICER HAS COMPLETED HIS 17 LEAVING 18 OR HER IMMEDIATE INVESTIGATION AT THE SCENE OF SUCH ACCIDENT. 19 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
