Introduced by M. of A. GUNTHER, SKOUFIS -- read once and referred to the Committee on Transportation -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to the distinctive gift of life license plates

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 404-u of the vehicle and traffic  
2 law, as added by chapter 415 of the laws of 2003, is amended to read as  
3 follows:

4     1. Any person residing in this state shall upon request be issued a  
5 distinctive license plate bearing the words ["Life Pass It On"] "DONATE  
6 LIFE NEW YORK STATE" AND "BE AN ORGAN & TISSUE DONOR". Application for  
7 said license plates shall be filed with the commissioner in such form  
8 and detail as the commissioner shall prescribe.

9     S 2. Distinctive plates issued pursuant to section 404-u of the vehi-  
10 cle and traffic law prior to the amendment of such section made by  
11 section one of this act shall be reissued to any person assigned such  
12 plate upon such person's request. No fee or service charge shall be  
13 charged for the reissuance of such plate. Provided, however, that  
14 notwithstanding the provisions of section one of this act, nothing  
15 contained in this act shall be deemed to invalidate "Life Pass it On"  
16 distinctive license plates issued prior to the effective date of this  
17 act.

18     S 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after  
19 it shall have become a law; provided, however, that effective immediate-  
20 ly, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation  
21 necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date is  
22 authorized and directed to be made and completed on or before such  
23 effective date.
