Introduced by M. of A. HAWLEY -- read once and referred to the Committee on Libraries and Education Technology

AN ACT creating the Seymour public library district in the towns of Sweden and Clarkson, New York including the Village of Brockport; and to amend chapter 672 of the laws of 1993 amending the public authorities law relating to the construction and financing of facilities for certain public libraries, in relation to including the Seymour public library district within the provisions of such chapter and providing for financing through the dormitory authority

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Creation of library district. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general, special, or local law to the contrary, there 2 3 is hereby created and established in the towns of Sweden and Clarkson, county of Monroe, a public library district which shall be known as the 4 5 Seymour public library district, hereinafter referred to as the district, and which shall consist of the entire town of Sweden, the б 7 entire town of Clarkson and also including the Village of Brockport 8 which lies wholly within such two towns. The district will operate a public library to be known as the Seymour public library. 9

10 S 2. Election. 1. The district herein described shall not come into 11 existence unless and until it is approved with the initial budget in 12 support thereof proposed by the board of trustees of the existing Seym-13 our library, and nine trustees are elected by a vote of the majority of 14 the qualified voters voting in an election held, not later than January 15 31, 2018, pursuant to the following provisions:

16 Upon receipt of a petition signed by not less than twenty-five voters 17 qualified to vote at a general election in the district, the board of 18 trustees of the existing Seymour library, shall conduct an election at 19 which the issues shall be:

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1 (a) whether the public library district herein described with the 2 initial budget in support thereof proposed by the board of trustees of 3 the existing Seymour library, shall be created or not; and 4

(b) the election of nine trustees as provided by this act.

The board of trustees of the existing Seymour library, shall give 5 6 notice of such election by publication of notice at least twice in one 7 more newspapers having a general circulation in the district to be or 8 served. The first publication of such notice shall be not less than thirteen days and not more than twenty days prior to the date of such 9 10 election. In addition, the board of trustees of the existing Seymour 11 library, shall cause copies of such notice to be posted conspicuously in three public places in the district at least thirteen days prior to the 12 date of such election. Such notice shall specify the date and time when 13 14 and the place where such election will be held and the issues to be 15 decided at such election. The board of trustees of the existing Seymour library, shall designate a resident qualified voter of such district to 16 act as chairperson of any election of such district and shall designate 17 18 less than two nor more than six resident qualified voters to act as not 19 election inspectors and ballot clerks at such election. No trustee of 20 the existing Seymour library, shall serve as chairperson or as an 21 election inspector or ballot clerk. The board of trustees of the exist-22 Seymour library, may adopt a resolution providing that such chairinq person, election inspectors and ballot clerks shall be paid reasonable 23 compensation for their respective services at such election. Every voter 24 25 who is a resident of the district and otherwise qualified to vote at a 26 general election in the town of Sweden, town of Clarkson or village of Brockport shall be qualified to vote at said election. The board of trustees of the existing Seymour library, may, to the extent authorized 27 28 29 law, authorize the use of absentee ballots for the election. After by 30 the polls have closed at such election, the election inspectors and the ballot clerks shall immediately canvass publicly the ballots cast and 31 32 the chairperson of the election shall publicly announce the result. 33 Within seventy-two hours thereafter, the chairperson, election inspectors and ballot clerks shall execute and file a certificate of the result of the canvass with the board of trustees of the existing Seymour 34 35 36 library, and the town and village clerks. If a majority of the voters 37 approve the formation of the district with the initial budget in support thereof proposed by the board of trustees of the existing Seymour library, then the district shall come into existence on the terms and 38 39 40 conditions set forth in this act.

41 2. In the event that the district is created, there shall be an annual 42 election conducted by the board of trustees of the Seymour public 43 library district in accordance with the provisions of subdivision one of 44 this section at a time to be set by the board of trustees of the 45 district, at which election vacancies on the board of trustees shall be filled and at which any proposed budget which the board shall determine 46 47 to submit to the voters pursuant to section four of this act shall be 48 submitted to the voters.

49 3. Candidates for the office of member of the board of trustees of the 50 Seymour public library district shall be nominated by petition. No 51 vacancy to be filled on the board of trustees shall be considered a 52 separate, specific office. A separate petition shall be required to nominate each candidate for a vacancy on the board. Each petition shall 53 54 be directed to the secretary of the board of trustees of the existing 55 Seymour library, shall be signed by at least twenty-five qualified voters of the district, shall state the residence of each signer, and 56

shall state the name and residence of the candidate. In the event that 1 2 any such nominees shall withdraw their candidacy prior to the election, 3 such person shall not be considered a candidate unless a new petition 4 nominating such person in the same manner and within the same time limi-5 tation applicable to other candidates is filed with the secretary of the 6 board of trustees of the existing Seymour library. Each petition shall 7 be filed with the secretary of the board of trustees of the existing 8 Seymour library, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., not later than the thirtieth day before the election at which the candidates nomi-9 10 nated are to be elected. In the event that the new district is created, petitions nominating candidates for the board of trustees for all future 11 elections shall be filed with the secretary of the Seymour public 12 13 library district.

14 3. Organization and structure. The Seymour public library district S 15 shall be managed, operated, and controlled by a board of trustees consisting of nine members. The trustees shall take office at the first regular meeting of the board of trustees following their election. At 16 17 18 first regular meeting of the board of trustees of the district, the the 19 trustees shall determine when the terms of office of each member shall 20 expire as follows: the trustees receiving the first and second highest 21 number of votes shall each serve for five years, the trustees receiving 22 third and fourth highest number of votes shall each serve for four the years, the trustees receiving the fifth and sixth highest number of 23 votes shall each serve for three years, the trustees receiving the 24 25 seventh and eighth highest number of votes shall serve for two years and 26 the trustee receiving the ninth highest number of votes shall serve for one year. As vacancies occur due to expiration of terms of office, trus-27 tees shall be elected by the voters of the district at the election 28 29 provided for by this act to serve five year terms, such terms to 30 commence at the first regular meeting of the board of trustees of the district next following their election. All other vacancies caused by 31 32 resignation, removal, death, or inability to serve shall be filled by 33 appointment by the board of trustees of the district until the next election, at which time the vacancy shall be filled by election for the 34 35 remaining portion of the term. At any election where one or more persons 36 are to be elected for the unexpired portion of a term or the terms, 37 candidate receiving the largest number of votes shall be entitled to the 38 full five year term and the candidates receiving the next highest number 39 of votes shall be entitled, in decreasing order of the respective 40 numbers of votes, to the vacancy or vacancies, in decreasing order of 41 the length of the unexpired portion or portions of a term or terms. Only qualified voters of the district shall be eligible for election to the board of trustees. The board of trustees at its first meeting after each 42 43 44 annual election shall elect or appoint a president, vice-president, and 45 a secretary, who shall be members of the board, and a treasurer and such other officers as they deem necessary. If the board so determines, the 46 47 office of treasurer may be held by an individual who is not a member of 48 the board of trustees and, in that event, such officer may, if the board 49 so determines, receive compensation as fixed by resolution of the board. 50 4. Finances. 1. The initial budget to support the district shall be S 51 determined by a vote of the voters of the district in the initial election as hereinafter provided for. All future budgets that increase 52 or decrease the district's proposed tax levy as compared to the tax levy 53 54 in the preceding fiscal year's budget shall be submitted to the resi-55 dents voting at the annual election of trustees pursuant to section two 56 of this act. Funds voted for library purposes at the initial election

1 and at all future elections shall be considered an annual appropriation 2 therefor and shall be levied and collected yearly by the towns of Sweden 3 and Clarkson for the district in the same manner and at the same time as 4 other taxes in the towns of Sweden and Clarkson.

5 The district's fiscal year shall run from the first day of January 2. 6 to the thirty-first day of December. The board of trustees of the 7 district shall annually file with the clerk of the towns on or before 8 the first day of November an estimate of the proposed budget including costs of library services to be raised by levy for the library district 9 10 in the fiscal year beginning on the first day of January of the next year. The towns shall not make any change in the estimate of revenues or 11 expenditures submitted by the board of the district in preparation of 12 their preliminary budgets. 13

14 The town board of the town of Sweden shall levy a tax against the 3. 15 real property lying within the district, except the real property lying 16 within the town of Clarkson, and the town board of the town of Clarkson shall levy a tax against the real property lying within the district, 17 18 except real property lying within the town of Sweden, which together shall equal the amount to be raised by tax as approved by the voters of 19 the district. Such tax shall be levied by the town of Sweden and the 20 town of Clarkson in proportion to the total combined value of the real 21 22 property lying within the town of Sweden and the town of Clarkson, including the parcels lying within the village of Brockport. The town 23 boards shall pay the full amount of the tax levy approved by the voters 24 25 over to the treasurer of the district pursuant to the schedule set forth 26 in this section. The town boards shall each annually pay over to the treasurer of the district on or before the thirtieth day after their respective tax collection period ends, the full amount of the levy due 27 28 29 from the parcels subject to their respective pay levy. If necessary to 30 meet this schedule, the town boards may issue tax anticipation notes pursuant to article II of the local finance law to obtain the necessary 31 32 moneys therefor.

33 The town boards of the towns of Sweden and Clarkson shall have the 4. 34 power to authorize, sell, and issue bonds, notes, and other evidences of indebtedness pursuant to the local finance law in order to permit the 35 district to provide facilities or improved facilities for library 36 37 purposes. Upon written request from the board of trustees of the district, after approval by the qualified voters of such district, and 38 to the extent the proposed capital improvements to the library facili-39 40 are to be constructed within the respective municipality, the town ties boards shall authorize, sell, and issue such bonds, notes, or other 41 evidences of indebtedness as are necessary to accomplish the improve-42 43 ments specified in the notice. The proceeds of such bonds, notes, or 44 other evidences of indebtedness shall be paid to the treasurer of the 45 district maintained in a segregated account in accordance with section 165.00 of the local finance law and expended by the treasurer only on 46 47 specific authorization by the board of trustees.

5. The board of trustees of the district may accept on behalf of the district any absolute gift, devise, or bequest of real or personal property and such conditional gifts, devises, or bequests as it shall by resolution approve.

52 6. The treasurer of the district shall be custodian of all funds of 53 the district, including gifts and trust funds paid over to the trustees. 54 The board of trustees may authorize the investment of funds in the 55 custody of the treasurer in the same manner in which town funds may be 56 invested. Proceeds of obligations received from the town may be invested

in accordance with section 165.00 of the local finance law. The town of 1 2 Sweden and the town of Clarkson shall promptly pay over to the district 3 all monies which belong to or are raised for the district. No monies be disbursed by the treasurer of the district except after audit 4 shall 5 by the board of trustees. The board of trustees of the district shall 6 audit all claims and shall order the payment thereof, except as other-7 wise provided by this section. No such claims shall be audited or 8 ordered paid by the trustees unless an itemized voucher therefor shall 9 be presented to the board of trustees for audit and allowance. The 10 provisions of this section shall not be applicable to payment of utility costs, claims of fixed salaries, and amounts which the district may be 11 required to pay on account of retirement contributions for past or 12 current services to officers and employees of the district. The treasur-13 14 shall keep such records in such manner as the board of trustees may er 15 require.

16 S 5. Charter, commencement of operations, and transfer of property and employees. The initially elected trustees of the district shall, 17 within 18 ninety days from the date of approval of the district by the voters of 19 the district, apply to the board of regents for a charter as a public library. Upon the granting of such a charter by the board of regents, 20 21 title to all liabilities and assets, including all property, both real 22 and personal, and both tangible and intangible, all trust and other funds, and all other obligations, now held by the existing Seymour library, shall be transferred to, vested in, and be acquired by the 23 24 25 district established by this act. The above provisions for transfer to, vesting and acquisition of real and personal property, both tangible and 26 27 intangible, and all trust and other funds, are effectuated by operation of law pursuant to the authority of this act, except that, for 28 purposes 29 clarity of real property records, deeds of conveyance shall be of 30 executed and filed for any parcels of real property. Upon the transfer all such property, the existing Seymour library shall be deemed 31 of 32 dissolved. Upon the granting of such charter by the board of regents, 33 all employees of the existing Seymour library shall become employees of 34 the district upon the same terms and conditions of employment and at the 35 same rate of pay as their previous employment by the existing Seymour 36 library.

37 6. Ad valorem levy. The several lots and parcels of land within the 38 area of the district are hereby determined to be benefited by the 39 library facilities and devices existing as of the effective date of this 40 and the towns of Sweden and Clarkson are hereby authorized to act, assess, levy, and collect the necessary expenses of operation, mainte-41 and repair of such facilities and services and such capital 42 nance, improvements, including debt service on bonds, notes, or other evidences 43 44 of indebtedness of the town issued for the purpose of the district, as 45 may be hereafter authorized pursuant to the provisions of this act from such lots and parcels of land in the same manner and at the same time as 46 47 other town charges.

48 S 7. Education law. Except as otherwise provided by this act, the 49 provisions of the education law relating to public libraries shall be 50 applicable to the district established by this act.

51 S 8. The district is deemed a special district which is separate and 52 distinct from the towns and village for all purposes, including but not 53 limited to management, appropriations, and expenditures. Any tax levy 54 for the district shall not be charged or imputed to the towns or 55 village, and shall instead be charged or imputed to the district, for 56 purposes of any general or special laws enacted by the legislature.

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
