AN ACT to amend the executive law and the agriculture and markets law, in relation to therapy dogs and cats for persons with disabilities

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 21 of section 292 of the executive law, as amended by chapter 269 of the laws of 1997, is amended to read as follows:

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- 21. The term "disability" means (a) a physical, mental or medical impairment resulting from anatomical, physiological, genetic or neurological conditions which prevents the exercise of a normal bodily func-SUBSTANTIALLY LIMITS ONE OR MORE OF SUCH PERSON'S MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES, or is demonstrable by medically accepted clinical or laboratory diagnostic techniques or (b) a record of such an impairment or (c) a condition regarded by others as such an impairment, provided, however, that in all provisions of this article dealing with employment, the term shall be limited to disabilities which, upon the provision of reasonable accommodations, do not prevent the complainant from performing in a reasonable manner the activities involved in the job or occupation FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES held. INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, CARING FOR ONESELF, PERFORMING MANUAL HEARING, EATING, SLEEPING, WALKING, STANDING, LIFTING, SEEING, BENDING, SPEAKING, BREATHING, LEARNING, READING, CONCENTRATING, COMMUNICATING, AND WORKING. MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES ALSO INCLUDE THE OPERATION OF A MAJOR BODILY FUNCTION, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, IMMUNE SYSTEM, NORMAL CELL GROWTH, DIGESTIVE, BOWEL, FUNCTIONS OF THEBLADDER, NEUROLOGICAL, BRAIN, RESPIRATORY, CIRCULATORY, ENDOCRINE, REPRODUCTIVE FUNCTIONS.
  - S 2. Subdivision 14 of section 296 of the executive law, as amended by chapter 141 of the laws of 2015, is amended to read as follows:
- 14. In addition to reasonable modifications in policies, practices, or procedures, including those defined in subparagraph (iv) of paragraph (d) of subdivision two of this section or reasonable accommodations for

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persons with disabilities as otherwise provided in this section, includthe use of an animal as a reasonable accommodation, it shall be an 3 unlawful discriminatory practice for any person engaged in any covered by this section to deny access or otherwise to discriminate 5 against a blind person, a hearing impaired person or a person another disability because he or she is accompanied by a dog that has 6 7 been trained to work or perform specific tasks for the benefit of person by a professional guide dog, hearing dog or service dog training 8 center or professional guide dog, hearing dog or service dog trainer, or 9 10 to discriminate against such professional guide dog, hearing service dog trainer engaged in such training of a dog for use by a 11 12 person with a disability, whether or not accompanied by the person for 13 whom the dog is being trained. THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY REGARDLESS OF 14 BREED, OR ANY OTHER TYPE OF THERAPY DOG OR CAT.

- S 3. Subdivision 26 of section 108 of the agriculture and markets law, as amended by chapter 536 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:
- 26. "Therapy dog OR CAT" means any dog OR CAT that is trained to aid the emotional and physical health of patients in hospitals, nursing homes, retirement homes, PERSONAL RESIDENCES, and other settings and is actually used for such purpose, or any dog OR CAT during the period such dog OR CAT is being trained or bred for such purpose.
- S 4. Subdivision 1 of section 356 of the executive law is amended to read as follows:
- 1. A state veterans' service agency established by the division pursuant to this article shall have power and it shall be its duty to inform military and naval authorities of the United States and assist members the armed forces and veterans, who are residents of this state, and their families, in relation to (1) matters pertaining to educational training and retraining services and facilities, (2) health, medical and rehabilitation services and facilities, (3) provisions of federal, state laws and regulations affording special rights and privileges and local to members of the armed forces and war veterans and their families, employment and re-employment services, [and] (5) HOUSING **SERVICES** INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO INSTANCES OF DISCRIMINATION, AND (6) similar, related or appropriate nature. The state veterans' matters of service agency also shall perform such other duties as may be by the state director.
  - S 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
