AN ACT to amend the labor law, in relation to making contractors ineligible to bid for a public work contract if prevailing rate wages and supplements due from a prior public work contract remain unpaid

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Paragraph b of subdivision 3 of section 220-b of the labor law is amended by adding a new subparagraph 1-a to read as follows:

(1-A) WHEN A FINAL DETERMINATION HAS BEEN RENDERED AGAINST A CONTRAC-SUCCESSOR, OR ANY SUBSTANTIALLY-OWNED AFFILIATED SUBCONTRACTOR, ENTITY OF THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR, ANY OF THE PARTNERS CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR IS A PARTNERSHIP, ANY OFFICER OF THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR WHO KNOWINGLY PARTICIPATED IN THE VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE, ANY OF THE SHAREHOLDERS WHO OWN OR CONTROL AT LEAST TEN CENTUM OF THE OUTSTANDING STOCK OF THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR OR ANY SUCCESSOR HAS WILFULLY FAILED TO PAY THE PREVAILING RATE OF WAGES OR TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS ARTICLE, WHETHER FAILURES WERE CONCURRENT OR CONSECUTIVE, SUCH CONTRACTOR, SUBCONTRACTOR, SUCCESSOR, OR ANY SUBSTANTIALLY-OWNED AFFILIATED ENTITY OF THE CONTRAC-

- TRACTOR IS A PARTNERSHIP OR ANY OF THE SHAREHOLDERS WHO OWN OR CONTROL 15 THECONTRACTOR
- 16 AT LEAST TEN PER CENTUM OF THE OUTSTANDING STOCK OF 17 SUBCONTRACTOR, ANY OFFICER OF THE CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR WHO KNOW-
- 18 INGLY PARTICIPATED IN THE VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE INELIGIBLE
- TO SUBMIT A BID ON OR BE AWARDED ANY PUBLIC WORK CONTRACT OR SUBCONTRACT 19 ANY MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OR PUBLIC BODY UNLESS AND 20 WITH THE STATE,
- UNTIL ALL PREVAILING RATES OF WAGES AND SUPPLEMENTS DUE FROM ALL PRIOR 21
- 22 PUBLIC WORK CONTRACTS HAVE BEEN PAID.
