AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to creating a youth employment and career development program and making an appropriation therefor

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 2590-g of the education law is amended by adding a 2 new subdivision 13 to read as follows:

3 13. A. ESTABLISH A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, AS 4 FOLLOWS:

5 (1) THERE SHALL BE A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM 6 ADMINISTERED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. THE PROGRAM SHALL ENCOURAGE THE 7 DEVELOPMENT OF PART TIME AND FULL TIME JOBS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND 8 GRADUATES, PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH JOB TRAINING, PLACEMENT SERVICES AND 9 CAREER COUNSELING AND ASSIST HIGH SCHOOL FACULTY IN DEVELOPING AND 10 IMPLEMENTING A CURRICULUM TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH WORK-COMPETENCY TRAINING. 11

(2) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH C OF THIS SUBDIVISION, EACH 12 13 HIGH SCHOOL IN NEW YORK CITY MAY HAVE A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT OFFICE STAFFED BY A JOB COORDINATOR, A CAREER SPECIALIST AND 14 SUCH SUPPORT STAFF AS PERMITTED BY BUDGET ALLOCATIONS THEREFOR. 15 16

(3) THE JOB COORDINATOR SHALL:

(I) ACT AS LIAISON BETWEEN THE DIRECTORS OF ALL EMPLOYMENT-RELATED 17 18 PROGRAMS WITHIN THE SCHOOL, INCLUDING COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS, TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMS AND SCHOOL TO EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS; 19

20 (II) CONDUCT JOB AND CAREER FAIRS;

21 (III) ORGANIZE FIELD TRIPS TO BUSINESSES AND THE NEW YORK CITY JOB AND 22 CAREER CENTER;

23 (IV) WORK CLOSELY WITH THE NEW YORK CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION WORK EXPE-24 RIENCE AND TRAINING UNIT; AND

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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(V) COMPILE AND MAINTAIN CURRENT LISTS OF ALL JOBS AVAILABLE TO BE 1 2 FILLED BY PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS INCLUDING FULL TIME AND PART TIME EMPLOY-3 MENT OPPORTUNITIES. 4 (4) THE JOB DEVELOPER SHALL: 5 SOLICIT EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS FROM (I) 6 THE EMPLOYERS REPRESENTING PUBLIC SECTOR, PRIVATE SECTOR, 7 COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS; 8 (II) ENDEAVOR TO INCREASE INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AND DEVELOP OTHER 9 WORK-EXPERIENCE PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS; 10 (III) ASSIST PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IN SECURING FULL TIME AND PART TIME 11 SCHOOL YEAR AND SUMMER EMPLOYMENT; 12 TRAINING IN RESUME DRAFTING AND INTERVIEWING SKILLS TO (IV) PROVIDE 13 **PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS;** 14 (V) ASSIST SCHOOL OFFICIALS TO DEVELOP FLEXIBLE ACADEMIC SCHEDULES FOR 15 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS TO FACILITATE THE COMPLETION OF HIGH SCHOOL WHILE THE STUDENT IS EMPLOYED; 16 17 (VI) ACT AS AN ADVOCATE FOR PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IF DIFFICULTIES ARISE IN THE WORKPLACE; AND 18 19 (VII) CONTINUE TO PROVIDE JOB PLACEMENT AND COUNSELING SERVICES TO PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS ONE YEAR SUBSEQUENT TO GRADUATION. 20 21 (5) ALL PROGRAM STAFF SHALL BE EMPLOYED PURSUANT TO APPLICABLE CITY 22 AND STATE REGULATIONS. 23 B. EACH SCHOOL OPERATING A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT 24 PROGRAM SHALL BE EOUIPPED WITH AN OFFICE OR CLASSROOM TO ACCOMMODATE 25 PROGRAM STAFF. THE OFFICE SHALL CONTAIN APPROPRIATE FURNITURE, CARPET-26 ING, TELEPHONES, TELEFAX MACHINES, COPYING MACHINES AND OTHER OFFICE SUPPLIES NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH THE ATMOSPHERE OF A MODERN BUSINESS 27 OFFICE. THIS OFFICE SHALL BE OPEN EIGHT HOURS PER DAY, ON A YEAR-ROUND 28 29 BASIS, AND SHALL BE USED TO ACCOMMODATE PROGRAM STAFF AND TO FACILITATE STUDENT CAREER TRAINING AND COUNSELING. 30 C. ANY HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL WISHING TO IMPLEMENT THE YOUTH EMPLOYMENT 31 32 AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN HIS OR HER HIGH SCHOOL SHALL SUBMIT A 33 WRITTEN REQUEST TO THE CHANCELLOR OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR SUCH 34 PROGRAM. THE CHANCELLOR SHALL SELECT THE HIGH SCHOOLS IN WHICH THE PROGRAM SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED. THE CHANCELLOR SHALL TAKE ALL STEPS NECES-35 SARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM IN THE SELECTED SCHOOLS IN A PROMPT 36 37 MANNER; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT, ONE YEAR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF 38 THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED IN NO MORE THAN THIR-39 TY-TWO NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOLS. WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE 40 DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED IN NO MORE THAN SIXTY-FOUR NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOLS; AND WITHIN THREE YEARS AFTER THE 41 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED 42 IN 43 EVERY NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOL. 44 2. Section 2590-g of the education law is amended by adding a new S 45 subdivision 7 to read as follows: 7. A. ESTABLISH A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, 46 AS 47 FOLLOWS: 48 (1)THERE SHALL BE A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM 49 ADMINISTERED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. THE PROGRAM SHALL ENCOURAGE THE DEVELOPMENT OF PART TIME AND FULL TIME JOBS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND 50 51 GRADUATES, PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH JOB TRAINING, PLACEMENT SERVICES AND CAREER COUNSELING AND ASSIST HIGH SCHOOL FACULTY IN DEVELOPING 52 AND IMPLEMENTING A CURRICULUM TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH WORK-COMPETENCY 53 54 TRAINING. 55 (2) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH C OF THIS SUBDIVISION, EACH 56 HIGH SCHOOL IN NEW YORK CITY MAY HAVE A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER

DEVELOPMENT OFFICE STAFFED BY A JOB COORDINATOR, A CAREER SPECIALIST AND 1 2 SUCH SUPPORT STAFF AS PERMITTED BY BUDGET ALLOCATIONS THEREFOR. 3 (3) THE JOB COORDINATOR SHALL: 4 (I) ACT AS LIAISON BETWEEN THE DIRECTORS OF ALL EMPLOYMENT-RELATED 5 PROGRAMS WITHIN THE SCHOOL, INCLUDING COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS, 6 TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMS AND SCHOOL TO EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS; 7 (II) CONDUCT JOB AND CAREER FAIRS; 8 (III) ORGANIZE FIELD TRIPS TO BUSINESSES AND THE NEW YORK CITY JOB AND 9 CAREER CENTER; 10 (IV) WORK CLOSELY WITH THE NEW YORK CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION WORK EXPE-RIENCE AND TRAINING UNIT; AND 11 12 (V) COMPILE AND MAINTAIN CURRENT LISTS OF ALL JOBS AVAILABLE TO BE FILLED BY PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS INCLUDING FULL TIME AND PART TIME EMPLOY-13 14 MENT OPPORTUNITIES. 15 (4) THE JOB DEVELOPER SHALL: (I) SOLICIT EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS 16 FROM 17 REPRESENTING THE PUBLIC EMPLOYERS SECTOR, PRIVATE SECTOR, COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS; 18 19 (II) ENDEAVOR TO INCREASE INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AND DEVELOP OTHER 20 WORK-EXPERIENCE PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS; 21 ASSIST PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IN SECURING FULL TIME AND PART TIME (III) 22 SCHOOL YEAR AND SUMMER EMPLOYMENT; 23 (IV) PROVIDE TRAINING IN RESUME DRAFTING AND INTERVIEWING SKILLS ΤO 24 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS; 25 (V) ASSIST SCHOOL OFFICIALS TO DEVELOP FLEXIBLE ACADEMIC SCHEDULES FOR 26 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS TO FACILITATE THE COMPLETION OF HIGH SCHOOL WHILE 27 THE STUDENT IS EMPLOYED; 28 (VI) ACT AS AN ADVOCATE FOR PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IF DIFFICULTIES ARISE 29 IN THE WORKPLACE; AND (VII) CONTINUE TO PROVIDE JOB PLACEMENT AND COUNSELING SERVICES 30 ΤO PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS ONE YEAR SUBSEQUENT TO GRADUATION. 31 32 (5) ALL PROGRAM STAFF SHALL BE EMPLOYED PURSUANT TO APPLICABLE CITY 33 AND STATE REGULATIONS. 34 B. EACH SCHOOL OPERATING A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM SHALL BE EOUIPPED WITH AN OFFICE OR CLASSROOM TO ACCOMMODATE 35 PROGRAM STAFF. THE OFFICE SHALL CONTAIN APPROPRIATE FURNITURE, CARPET-36 37 ING, TELEPHONES, TELEFAX MACHINES, COPYING MACHINES AND OTHER OFFICE 38 SUPPLIES NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH THE ATMOSPHERE OF A MODERN BUSINESS 39 OFFICE. THIS OFFICE SHALL BE OPENED EIGHT HOURS PER DAY, ON A YEAR-ROUND 40 BASIS, AND SHALL BE USED TO ACCOMMODATE PROGRAM STAFF AND TO FACILITATE STUDENT CAREER TRAINING AND COUNSELING. 41 C. ANY HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL WISHING TO IMPLEMENT THE YOUTH EMPLOYMENT 42 43 AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN HIS OR HER HIGH SCHOOL SHALL SUBMIT A 44 WRITTEN REQUEST TO THE CHANCELLOR OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR SUCH 45 PROGRAM. THE CHANCELLOR SHALL SELECT THE HIGH SCHOOLS IN WHICH THE PROGRAM SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED. THE CHANCELLOR SHALL TAKE ALL STEPS NECES-46 47 THE PROGRAM IN THE SELECTED SCHOOLS IN A PROMPT TO IMPLEMENT SARY 48 MANNER; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT, ONE YEAR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF 49 THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED IN NO MORE THAN THIR-50 TY-TWO NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOLS. WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE 51 DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED IN NO MORE THAN SIXTY-FOUR NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOLS; AND WITHIN THREE YEARS AFTER THE 52 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED IN 53 54 EVERY NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOL. 55 3. The sum of seven million five hundred thousand dollars S 56 (\$7,500,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appro-

priated to the department of education from any monies in the state treasury in the general fund to the credit of the local assistance 1 2 3 account for purposes of providing for the state's share of the necessary 4 appropriation to the board of education of the city of New York for the 5 operation of the youth employment and career development program estab-6 lished by this act provided, however, that no expenditures shall be made 7 available from this appropriation for any purpose unless and until an 8 appropriation to such board of education of the city of New York is made 9 by such city and then only in amounts matching such moneys paid to such 10 board of education. Such sum shall be payable on the audit and warrant of the state comptroller on vouchers certified or approved by the 11 12 commissioner of education, or his or her duly designated representative in the manner provided by law. Consistent with the foregoing provisions 13 14 this act, no expenditure shall be made from this appropriation until of 15 a certificate of approval of availability shall have been issued by the director of the budget and filed with the state comptroller and a copy 16 17 filed with the chairman of the senate finance committee and the chairman 18 of the assembly ways and means committee. Such certificate may be 19 amended from time to time by the director of the budget and a copy of each such amendment shall be filed with the state comptroller, the 20 chairman of the senate finance committee and the chairman of the assem-21 22 bly ways and means committee.

S 4. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that the amendments to section 2590-g of the education law made by section one of this act shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such section pursuant to section 34 of chapter 91 of the laws of 2002, as amended, when upon such date the provisions of section two of this act shall take effect.
