- AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to assaulting a retired police officer

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 120.05 of the penal law is amended by adding a new 2 subdivision 14 to read as follows:

WITH 3 14. THE INTENT TO CAUSE PHYSICAL INJURY TO A SPECIFIC RETIRED POLICE OFFICER, AS POLICE OFFICER IS DEFINED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION 4 5 SECTION 1.20 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE LAW, DUE TO A THIRTY-FOUR OF 6 BELIEF OR PERCEPTION REGARDING SUCH RETIRED POLICE OFFICER'S INVOLVEMENT 7 IN A PREVIOUS ARREST OF SUCH PERSON WHILE ON ACTIVE DUTY, HE OR SHE 8 CAUSES SUCH INJURY TO SUCH RETIRED POLICE OFFICER OR A THIRD PERSON.

9 S 2. Subdivision 4 of section 120.10 of the penal law, as amended by 10 chapter 791 of the laws of 1967, is amended and a new subdivision 5 is 11 added to read as follows:

4. In the course of and in furtherance of the commission or attempted commission of a felony or of immediate flight therefrom, he, or another participant if there be any, causes serious physical injury to a person other than one of the participants[.]; OR

WITH INTENT TO CAUSE SERIOUS PHYSICAL INJURY TO A SPECIFIC RETIRED AS POLICE OFFICER IS DEFINED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION 17 POLICE OFFICER, THIRTY-FOUR OF SECTION 1.20 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE 18 LAW, DUE TO A BELIEF OR PERCEPTION REGARDING SUCH RETIRED POLICE OFFICER'S INVOLVEMENT 19 20 A PREVIOUS ARREST OF SUCH PERSON WHILE ON ACTIVE DUTY, HE OR SHE IN 21 CAUSES SUCH INJURY TO SUCH RETIRED POLICE OFFICER OR TO A THIRD PERSON.

22 S 3. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 23 have become a law.
