- AN ACT to amend the real property tax law, in relation to extending the enhanced STAR exemption to the disabled surviving spouse of a previously qualifying individual

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 4 of 1 section 425 of the real property tax law, as added by section 4 of part 2 3 A of chapter 405 of the laws of 1999, is amended to read as follows: 4 (iii) In the case of property owned by husband and wife, one of whom is sixty-five years of age or over, the exemption, once granted, 5 shall not be rescinded solely because of the death of the older spouse so long 6 7 the surviving spouse is at least sixty-two years of age OR IS PHYSas 8 ICALLY DISABLED as of the date specified in this paragraph. TO QUALIFY PHYSICALLY DISABLED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH, AN INDI-9 AS 10 VIDUAL SHALL SUBMIT TO THE ASSESSOR A CERTIFIED STATEMENT FROM A PHYSI-IN THE STATE ON A FORM PRESCRIBED AND MADE PRACTICE 11 CIAN LICENSED ТО AVAILABLE BY THE COMMISSIONER WHICH STATES THAT 12 THE INDIVIDUAL HAS A PHYSICAL IMPAIRMENT WHICH SUBSTANTIALLY LIMITS ONE OR MORE OF 13 PERMANENT SUCH INDIVIDUAL'S MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES, EXCEPT THAT AN 14 INDIVIDUAL WHO 15 HAS OBTAINED A CERTIFICATE FROM THE STATE COMMISSION FOR THE VISUALLY HANDICAPPED STATING THAT SUCH INDIVIDUAL IS LEGALLY BLIND MAY 16 SUBMIT SUCH CERTIFICATE IN LIEU OF A PHYSICIAN'S CERTIFIED STATEMENT. THE OTHER 17 REOUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBDIVISION MUST STILL BE MET FOR THE ENHANCED 18 EXEMPTION TO BE GRANTED TO A SURVIVING SPOUSE UNDER THIS SUBPARAGRAPH. 19 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately and shall 20 apply to the 21 administration of the enhanced STAR exemption beginning with the

22 2015-2016 school year.
