AN ACT to amend the general business law and the public health law, in relation to requiring the department of health to review the safety of ultraviolet nail dryers and authorizing the department of state to promulgate any regulations deemed appropriate for governing the use of such devices by any appearance enhancement business

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 2 404-c to read as follows:
 - S 404-C. ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICES. 1. "ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICE" SHALL MEAN ANY EQUIPMENT WHICH IS DESIGNED TO EMIT ELECTROMAGNETIC RADIATION IN THE WAVELENGTH INTERVAL OF TWO HUNDRED TO FOUR HUNDRED NANOMETERS IN AIR, AND WHICH IS INTENDED TO INDUCE NAIL CURING OR HARDENING THROUGH IRRADIATION.
 - THE COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH MAKES A DETERMINATION PURSUANT TO SECTION THIRTY-FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW THAT ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICES POSE A HEALTH HAZARD TO USERS, ANY APPEARANCE ENHANCEMENT BUSINESS WHERE THE PRACTICE OF NAIL SPECIALTY CONDUCTED SHALL PROMINENTLY POST THE NOTICE DEVELOPED BY THE DEPARTMENT REGARDING SUCH HEALTH HAZARD IN AN AREA CLEARLY VISIBLE TO PATRONS LICENSED APPEARANCE ENHANCEMENT BUSINESS WHERE THE PRACTICE OF NAIL SPECIALTY IS CONDUCTED OR IN THE PLACE PRACTICE OF WHERE THESPECIALTY LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE IS CONDUCTED. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP AND MAKE SUCH SIGN AVAILABLE TO EACH LICENSEE.
- 18 3. IF THE COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH MAKES A DETERMINATION PURSUANT TO 19 SECTION THIRTY-FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY-SIX OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW THAT

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1 ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICES POSE A HEALTH HAZARD TO USERS, ANY 2 APPEARANCE ENHANCEMENT BUSINESS THAT UTILIZES SUCH DEVICES SHALL COMPLY 3 WITH ANY AND ALL REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO THIS 4 ARTICLE.

- S 2. Section 3550 of the public health law, as added by chapter 378 of the laws of 1990, is amended to read as follows:
 - S 3550. Definitions. When used in this article, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section:
- 1. "Tanning facility" shall mean any establishment where one or more ultraviolet radiation device is used, offered, or made available for use by any human being, for which a fee is charged, directly or indirectly, but shall not include any facility where any such device is used by a qualified health care professional for treatment of medical conditions.
- 2. "Ultraviolet radiation device" shall mean any equipment which is designed to emit electromagnetic radiation in the wavelength interval of two hundred to four hundred nanometers in air, and which is intended to induce tanning of the human skin through irradiation, including, but not limited to, a sunlamp, tanning booth, or tanning bed.
- 3. "ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICE" SHALL MEAN ANY EQUIPMENT WHICH IS DESIGNED TO EMIT ELECTROMAGNETIC RADIATION IN THE WAVELENGTH INTERVAL OF TWO HUNDRED TO FOUR HUNDRED NANOMETERS IN AIR, AND WHICH IS INTENDED TO INDUCE NAIL CURING OR HARDENING THROUGH IRRADIATION.
- 4. "Person" shall mean an individual, corporation, partnership, joint venture, or any business entity.
- S 3. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 3556 to read as follows:
- 3556. ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICES. 1. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL EXISTING MEDICAL AND SCIENTIFIC LITERATURE, REVIEW THE **PUBLISHED** REPORTS, AND ARTICLES REGARDING THE POTENTIAL HEALTH HAZARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THE USE OF ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICES AND IDENTIFY ANY HEALTH AS PART OF SUCH REVIEW, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONSULT WITH EXPERTS IN THE FIELDS OF SKIN CANCER RESEARCH AND HUMAN EXPOSURE TO ARTIFICIAL ULTRAVIOLET RADIATION. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ALSO REVIEW THE FEASIBILITY AND EFFECTIVENESS OF REQUIRING APPEARANCE ENHANCEMENT NESSES CONDUCTING THE PRACTICE OF NAIL SPECIALTY, AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVI-SION FOUR OF SECTION FOUR HUNDRED OF THE GENERAL BUSINESS LAW, TO ADVISE USERS OF ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING DEVICES TO APPLY A SUNSCREEN OR A SIMI-SUBSTANCE DESIGNED TO BLOCK ULTRAVIOLET RADIATION TO THE HANDS AND WRISTS PRIOR TO USING SUCH DEVICE.
- 2. UPON COMPLETION OF SUCH REVIEW, BASED onTHEFINDINGS DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE MAY PROMULGATE ANY REGULATIONS DEEMED APPROPRIATE FOR GOVERNING THE USE OF ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYING BY ANY APPEARANCE ENHANCEMENT BUSINESS, REQUIRED TO BE LICENSED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE PURSUANT TO ARTICLE TWENTY-SEVEN GENERAL BUSINESS LAW. IF PROMULGATED, SUCH REGULATIONS SHALL INCLUDE A REQUIREMENT THAT ANY APPEARANCE ENHANCEMENT BUSINESS CONDUCTING OF NAIL SPECIALTY POST A NOTICE REGARDING ANY HEALTH HAZARDS PRACTICE ASSOCIATED WITH THE USE OF ULTRAVIOLET NAIL DRYERS AND ANY STEPS TAKE TO MITIGATE SUCH HAZARDS IN AN AREA CLEARLY VISIBLE TO PATRONS IN THE LICENSED PREMISES OR IN THE PLACE WHERE THE PRACTICE OF AN PATION LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE TWENTY-SEVEN OF THE GENERAL BUSINESS LAW IS CONDUCTED.
- S 4. This act shall take effect immediately, except that sections one and two of this act, and subdivision 2 of section 3556 of the public health law, as added by section three of this act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after this act shall have become a law.
