AN ACT to amend the civil service law, in relation to scheduling an examination for any position or positions in the classified services that provides child protection services

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 4 of section 7 of the civil service law, as 1 2 added by chapter 790 of the laws of 1958, is amended to read as follows: 4. Subject to the provisions of this chapter and the rules established thereunder, he shall make regulations for and have control of examinations for the service of the state, and the civil divisions thereof, except civil divisions for which a municipal commission performs such 7 and shall supervise and preserve the records function, thereof. 8 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, UPON THE REQUEST OF A MUNICIPAL CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION OR PERSONNEL OFFICER AS 9 APPLICABLE, WHERE SUCH LOCAL COMMISSION OR PERSONNEL OFFICER 10 CERTIFIES THE NEED FOR THE IMMEDIATE SCHEDULING OF AN EXAMINATION FOR ANY POSITION 11 IN THE CLASSIFIED SERVICES THAT PROVIDES CHILD PROTECTION 12 POSITIONS SERVICES PURSUANT TO TITLE SIX OF ARTICLE SIX OF 13 THE SOCIAL **SERVICES** SHALL IMMEDIATELY ANNOUNCE, SCHEDULE, SCORE, AND 14 PRESIDENT CERTIFY THE RESULTS OF SUCH EXAMINATION. SUCH EXAMINATION SHALL HAVE 15 16 PRIORITY OVER ALL OTHER EXAMINATIONS THAT HAVE BEEN REQUESTED OR ARE OTHERWISE BEING SCHEDULED. IN NO EVENT SHALL THE PROCESS OF 17 OFFERING 18 SUCH EXAMINATION TAKE LONGER THAN SIXTY DAYS. THIS PROVISION SHALL BE APPLICABLE NOTWITHSTANDING THE EXISTENCE OF AN EXISTING CIVIL 19 LIST AND NOTWITHSTANDING THE ABSENCE OF CURRENTLY VACANT POSITIONS IN 20 21 SUCH CLASSIFIED TITLE OR TITLES.

22 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
