- AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to aggravated sexual offenses; and to amend the criminal procedure law, in relation to youthful offender status

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of subdivision 1 of section 2 70.02 of the penal law, paragraphs (a) and (c) as amended by chapter 368 3 of the laws of 2015, and paragraph (b) as amended by chapter 1 of the 4 laws of 2013, are amended to read as follows:

substance in the first degree as defined in section 240.62, placing a 1 false bomb or hazardous substance in a sports stadium or arena, mass 2 3 transportation facility or enclosed shopping mall as defined in section 4 240.63, and aggravated unpermitted use of indoor pyrotechnics in the first degree as defined in section 405.18. 5 6 S 2. The penal law is amended by adding three new sections 130.36, 7 130.51 and 130.71 to read as follows: 8 S 130.36 AGGRAVATED RAPE. 9 A MALE IS GUILTY OF AGGRAVATED RAPE WHEN HE ENGAGES IN SEXUAL INTER-10 COURSE WITH A FEMALE BY FORCIBLE COMPULSION AND WHEN, IN THE COURSE OF 11 COMMISSION OF THE CRIME OR OF IMMEDIATE FLIGHT THEREFROM, HE OR THE 12 ANOTHER PARTICIPANT IN THE CRIME: 1. Conduct performed for a valid medical purpose does not violate the 27 provisions of this section. 28 Aggravated sexual abuse in the [third] FOURTH degree is a class D 29 felony. S 5. Section 130.67 of the penal law, as added by chapter 450 of the 30 laws of 1988, the opening paragraph of subdivision 1 as amended by chap-31 32 ter 485 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows: 33 S 130.67 Aggravated sexual abuse in the [second] THIRD degree. 34 A person is guilty of aggravated sexual abuse in the [second] 1. THIRD degree when he or she inserts a finger in the vagina, urethra, 35 36 penis, rectum or anus of another person causing physical injury to such 37 person: 38 (a) By forcible compulsion; or 39 (b) When the other person is incapable of consent by reason of being 40 physically helpless; or (c) When the other person is less than eleven years old. 41 42 Conduct performed for a valid medical purpose does not violate the 2. 43 provisions of this section. 44 Aggravated sexual abuse in the [second] THIRD degree is a class C 45 felony. 46 S 6. Section 130.70 of the penal law, as amended by chapter 450 of the laws of 1988, the opening paragraph of subdivision 1 as amended by chap-47 48 ter 485 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows: S 130.70 Aggravated sexual abuse in the [first] SECOND degree. 49 50 A person is guilty of aggravated sexual abuse in the [first] 1. SECOND degree when he or she inserts a foreign object in the vagina, 51 52 urethra, penis, rectum or anus of another person causing physical injury 53 to such person: 54 (a) By forcible compulsion; or 55 When the other person is incapable of consent by reason of being (b) 56 physically helpless; or

(c) When the other person is less than eleven years old.

2 2. Conduct performed for a valid medical purpose does not violate the 3 provisions of this section.

4 Aggravated sexual abuse in the [first] SECOND degree is a class B 5 felony.

6 S 7. Subdivisions 2 and 3 of section 720.10 of the criminal procedure 7 law, subdivision 2 as amended by chapter 416 of the laws of 1986, para-8 graph (a) of subdivision 2 as amended by chapter 316 of the laws of 2006 9 and subdivision 3 as amended by chapter 264 of the laws of 2003, are 10 amended to read as follows:

11 2. "Eligible youth" means a youth who is eligible to be found a 12 youthful offender. Every youth is so eligible unless:

(a) the conviction to be replaced by a youthful offender finding is for (i) a class A-I or class A-II felony, or (ii) an armed felony as defined in subdivision forty-one of section 1.20, except as provided in subdivision three, or (iii) rape in the first degree, criminal sexual act in the first degree, or aggravated sexual abuse IN THE SECOND BEGREE, except as provided in subdivision three, or

(b) such youth has previously been convicted and sentenced for a felo-20 ny, or

(c) such youth has previously been adjudicated a youthful offender following conviction of a felony or has been adjudicated on or after September first, nineteen hundred seventy-eight a juvenile delinquent who committed a designated felony act as defined in the family court act.

Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision two, a youth who has been convicted of an armed felony offense or of rape in the first degree, criminal sexual act in the first degree, or aggravated sexual 27 28 abuse IN THE SECOND DEGREE is an eligible youth if the court determines 29 that one or more of the following factors exist: (i) mitigating circum-30 stances that bear directly upon the manner in which the crime was 31 32 committed; or (ii) where the defendant was not the sole participant in 33 crime, the defendant's participation was relatively minor although the 34 not so minor as to constitute a defense to the prosecution. Where the 35 court determines that the eligible youth is a youthful offender, the court shall make a statement on the record of the reasons for its deter-36 37 mination, a transcript of which shall be forwarded to the state division of criminal justice services, to be kept in accordance with the 38 39 provisions of subdivision three of section eight hundred thirty-seven-a 40 of the executive law.

S 8. This act shall take effect on the first of November next succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law; provided that if chapter 368 of the laws of 2015 has not taken effect prior to such effective date, then paragraphs (a) and (c) of subdivision 1 of section 70.02 of the penal law, as amended by section one of this act, such paragraphs shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as chapter 368 of the laws of 2015 takes effect.

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
