AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the powers and duties of boards of cooperative educational services

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subparagraph 1 of paragraph d of subdivision 4 of section
2 1950 of the education law, as amended by chapter 474 of the laws of
3 1996, is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) [*Aidable shared services*] COOPERATIVE SERVICES (COSERS). (I) At
5 the request of TWO OR MORE component school districts, and with the
6 approval of the commissioner, provide any of the following AIDABLE COOP-
7 ERATIVE services [*on a cooperative basis*] (COSERS): school nurse teach-
8 er, attendance supervisor, supervisor of teachers, dental hygienist,
9 psychologist, teachers of art, music, physical education, career educa-
10 tion subjects, guidance counsellors, operation of special classes for
11 students with disabilities, as such term is defined in article eighty-
12 nine of this chapter; pupil and financial accounting service by means of
13 mechanical equipment; maintenance and operation of cafeteria or restau-
14 rant service for the use of pupils and teachers while at school, and
15 such other AIDABLE OR NONAIDABLE services as the commissioner may
16 approve. Such cafeteria or restaurant service may be used by the commu-
17 nity for school related functions and activities and to furnish meals to
18 the elderly residents of the district, sixty years of age or older.
19 Utilization by elderly residents or school related groups shall be
20 subject to the approval of the board of education. Charges shall be
21 sufficient to bear the direct cost of preparation and serving of such
22 meals, exclusive of any other available reimbursements.

23 (II) THE COMMISSIONER SHALL BY REGULATION ESTABLISH THE PROCESS FOR
24 CONSIDERING AND APPROVING AIDABLE AND NONAIDABLE COOPERATIVE SERVICES
25 (COSERS). SUCH REGULATIONS SHALL ESTABLISH CRITERIA TO BE APPLIED BY THE

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1 COMMISSIONER IN APPROVING PROPOSED COSERS. SUCH CRITERIA SHALL INCLUDE:
2 CONSIDERATION OF THE POTENTIAL FOR PARTICIPANT SCHOOL DISTRICTS TO
3 ACHIEVE COST SAVINGS OR TO UTILIZE RESOURCES, INCLUDING FACILITIES, MORE
4 EFFICIENTLY; NEED FOR SUCH SERVICES WITHIN THE LOCAL AREA OR REGION TO
5 BE SERVED; THE OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS, INCLUDING THOSE WITH DISABIL-
6 ITIES, TO EARN CREDIT FOR ACADEMIC SUBJECTS; THE OPPORTUNITIES FOR
7 STUDENTS TO BE PREPARED TO PARTICIPATE IN SOCIETY OR THE WORKFORCE; AND
8 ANY OTHER MATTERS WHICH WOULD ENCOURAGE AND FOSTER COOPERATION.

9 S 2. Paragraph h of subdivision 4 of section 1950 of the education law
10 is amended by adding two new subparagraphs 12 and 13 to read as follows:

11 (12) TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS AS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE PURPOSES OF
12 THE BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AS OUTLINED IN THIS
13 SECTION.

14 (13) TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS WITH CHARTER SCHOOLS AUTHORIZED BY ARTI-
15 CLE FIFTY-SIX OF THIS CHAPTER, TO PROVIDE SERVICES AS AUTHORIZED BY THIS
16 SECTION.

17 S 3. Subparagraph (a) of paragraph p of subdivision 4 of section 1950
18 of the education law, as amended by chapter 374 of the laws of 2014, is
19 amended to read as follows:

20 (a) To rent suitable land, classrooms, offices or buildings upon or in
21 which to maintain and conduct such cooperative educational services and
22 administrative offices for a period not to exceed [ten] TWENTY years for
23 leases entered into with public entities and twenty years for leases
24 entered into with non-public entities and to improve, alter, equip and
25 furnish such land, classrooms, offices or buildings in a suitable manner
26 for such purposes, provided that: (1) before executing any lease, the
27 board shall adopt a resolution determining that such agreement is in the
28 best financial interests of the supervisory district and stating the
29 basis of that determination; (2) the rental payment shall not be more
30 than the fair market value as determined by the board and provided to
31 the commissioner; (3) The board discloses any conflict of interest
32 pursuant to subparagraph (c) of this paragraph, or any other potential
33 or perceived conflict of interest, to the commissioner, and in the event
34 of a conflict of interest or a potential or perceived conflict of inter-
35 est, provides detailed documentation to the commissioner demonstrating
36 that the cost of the lease is not more than fair market value; and (4)
37 upon the consent of the commissioner, renewal of such lease may be made
38 for a period of up to ten years. Nothing contained herein shall prevent
39 the board from entering into a lease agreement which provides for the
40 cancellation of the same by such board upon: (i) a substantial increase
41 or decrease in pupil enrollment; or (ii) a substantial change in the
42 needs and requirements of a board of cooperative educational services
43 with respect to facilities; or (iii) any other change which substantial-
44 ly affects the needs or requirements of a board of cooperative educa-
45 tional services or the community in which it is located. No lease or
46 other contract for the occupancy of such land, classrooms, offices or
47 buildings shall be enforceable against the board of cooperative educa-
48 tional services unless and until the same shall have been approved in
49 writing by the commissioner. In the case of a lease longer than [ten]
50 TWENTY years, the commissioner's written approval must include a finding
51 that the proposed lease complies with all requirements of this paragraph
52 and would be more cost-effective than a lease of [ten] TWENTY years or
53 fewer.

54 S 4. Subparagraph (a) of paragraph p of subdivision 4 of section 1950
55 of the education law, as amended by chapter 602 of the laws of 1994, is
56 amended to read as follows:

1 (a) To rent suitable land, classrooms, offices or buildings upon or in
2 which to maintain and conduct such cooperative educational services and
3 administrative offices for a period not to exceed [ten] TWENTY years and
4 to improve, alter, equip and furnish such land, classrooms, offices or
5 buildings in a suitable manner for such purposes (1) before executing
6 any lease, the board shall adopt a resolution determining that such
7 agreement is in the best financial interests of the supervisory district
8 and stating the basis of that determination; (2) the rental payment
9 shall not be more than the fair market value as determined by the board;
10 and (3) upon the consent of the commissioner, renewal of such lease may
11 be made for a period of up to ten years. Nothing contained herein shall
12 prevent the board from entering into a lease agreement which provides
13 for the cancellation of the same by such board upon: (i) a substantial
14 increase or decrease in pupil enrollment; or (ii) a substantial change
15 in the needs and requirements of a board of cooperative educational
16 services with respect to facilities; or (iii) any other change which
17 substantially affects the needs or requirements of a board of cooper-
18 ative educational services or the community in which it is located. No
19 lease or other contract for the occupancy of such land, classrooms,
20 offices or buildings shall be enforceable against the board of cooper-
21 ative educational services unless and until the same shall have been
22 approved in writing by the commissioner.

23 S 5. Subparagraph 2 of paragraph bb of subdivision 4 of section 1950
24 of the education law, as added by chapter 53 of the laws of 1984, is
25 amended to read as follows:

26 (2) The commissioner may approve such programs and services AS COOPER-
27 ATIVE SERVICES (COSERS) AS PROVIDED BY SUBPARAGRAPH ONE OF PARAGRAPH D
28 OF THIS SUBDIVISION only if they (a) are requested by two or more compo-
29 nent school districts; AND (b) [will provide additional opportunities
30 for pupils; (c)] will be expected to result in a cost savings to the two
31 or more component school districts requesting the programs and
32 services[; (d) will provide greater opportunity for pupils, including
33 those with handicapping conditions, to earn credit for academic subjects
34 and (e) will insure a greater or more appropriate use of facilities by
35 boards of cooperative educational services].

36 S 6. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that
37 the amendments to subparagraph (a) of paragraph p of subdivision 4 of
38 section 1950 of the education law made by section three of this act
39 shall be subject to the expiration and reversion of such subparagraph
40 pursuant to section 4 of chapter 374 of the laws of 2014, as amended,
41 when upon such date the provisions of section four of this act shall
42 take effect.
