AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to requiring, in a city having a population of one million or more, the consent of the spouse or next of kin of an unclaimed deceased person prior to delivery of such person to a university, college, school, institute or mortuary school for embalming, dissection or autopsy

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 4211 of the public health law is amended by adding 2 two new subdivisions 3-a and 4-a to read as follows:

- 3-A. IN A CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE MILLION OR MORE, NO BODY OF A DECEASED PERSON SHALL BE DELIVERED OR RELEASED TO OR RECEIVED BY, ANY UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE, SCHOOL, INSTITUTE OR MORTUARY SCHOOL:
- (A) UNTIL THE SPOUSE, AND IF HE OR SHE SHALL HAVE HAD NO SPOUSE, OF THE DECEASED PERSON SHALL HAVE CONSENTED IN WRITING TO THE DELIVERY AND RELEASE OF THE BODY OF SUCH PERSON TO THE UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE, SCHOOL, INSTITUTE OR MORTUARY SCHOOL FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMBALM-DISSECTION OR AUTOPSY. THE UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE, SCHOOL, INSTITUTE OR MORTUARY SCHOOL DESIRING CUSTODY OF THE BODY OF A DECEASED PERSON SHALL HAVE THE DUTY TO LOCATE AND OBTAIN THE WRITTEN CONSENT OF THE SPOUSE OR NEXT OF KIN OF SUCH DECEASED PERSON. IN THEEVENT THAT THE SPOUSE OR NEXT OF KIN IS NOT LOCATED, THEN IT SHALL BE PRESUMED THAT THE DECEASED PERSON AND HIS OR HER FAMILY AND NEXT OF KIN OBJECT TO EMBALM-ING, DISSECTION AND AUTOPSY, AND THE BODY SHALL BE RELEASED FOR BURIAL; OR
- 18 (B) IF PRIOR TO HIS OR HER DEATH, THE PERSON SHALL HAVE EXPRESSED A 19 DESIRE THAT HIS OR HER BODY BE INTERRED OR OTHERWISE LAWFULLY DISPOSED
