AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to establishing the paint stewardship program

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Article 27 of the environmental conservation law is amended
2 by adding a new title 20 to read as follows:

5 SECTION 27-2001. DEFINITIONS.

6 27-2003. PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM.

7 27-2005. REGULATIONS.

8 27-2007. REPORTING.

9 S 27-2001. DEFINITIONS.

10 WHEN USED IN THIS TITLE:

11 1. "ARCHITECTURAL PAINT" MEANS INTERIOR AND EXTERIOR ARCHITECTURAL
12 COATINGS SOLD IN CONTAINERS OF FIVE GALLONS OR LESS. ARCHITECTURAL PAINT
13 DOES NOT INCLUDE INDUSTRIAL, ORIGINAL EQUIPMENT OR SPECIALTY COATINGS.

14 2. "DISTRIBUTOR" MEANS A PERSON THAT HAS A CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP
15 WITH ONE OR MORE PRODUCERS TO MARKET AND SELL ARCHITECTURAL PAINT TO
16 RETAILERS OR DIRECTLY TO CONSUMERS OR END-USERS IN THE STATE.

17 3. "ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND MANAGEMENT PRACTICES" MEANS PROCEDURES FOR
18 THE COLLECTION, STORAGE, TRANSPORTATION, REUSE, RECYCLING AND DISPOSAL
19 OF ARCHITECTURAL PAINT, TO BE IMPLEMENTED BY THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION OR SUCH REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION'S CONTRACTED
20 PARTNERS TO ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE FEDERAL, STATE AND

1 LOCAL LAWS, REGULATIONS AND ORDINANCES AND THE PROTECTION OF HUMAN
2 HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT. ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND MANAGEMENT PRACTICES
3 INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, RECORD KEEPING, THE TRACKING AND DOCU-
4 MENTING OF THE FATE OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT IN AND OUTSIDE OF THE STATE,
5 AND ENVIRONMENTAL LIABILITY COVERAGE FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AND FOR
6 THE OPERATIONS OF THE CONTRACTORS WORKING ON BEHALF OF THE PRODUCER OR
7 REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION.

8 4. "PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT" MEANS THE AMOUNT ADDED TO THE
9 PURCHASE PRICE OF ARCHITECTURAL PAINT SOLD IN THE STATE THAT IS NECES-
10 SARY TO COVER THE COST OF COLLECTING, TRANSPORTING AND PROCESSING POST-
11 CONSUMER PAINT BY THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION PURSUANT
12 TO THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM.

13 5. "PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM" OR "PROGRAM" MEANS A PROGRAM FOR THE
14 MANAGEMENT OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT OPERATED BY A PRODUCER OR REPRESEN-
15 TATIVE ORGANIZATION.

16 6. "POST-CONSUMER PAINT" MEANS ARCHITECTURAL PAINT THAT IS NOT USED
17 AND THAT IS NO LONGER WANTED BY A PURCHASER OF ARCHITECTURAL PAINT.

18 7. "PRODUCER" MEANS A MANUFACTURER OF ARCHITECTURAL PAINT WHO SELLS,
19 OFFERS FOR SALE, DISTRIBUTES OR CONTRACTS TO DISTRIBUTE ARCHITECTURAL
20 PAINT IN THE STATE.

21 8. "RECYCLING" MEANS THE SERIES OF ACTIVITIES BY WHICH RECYCLABLES ARE
22 COLLECTED, SORTED, PROCESSED AND CONVERTED INTO RAW MATERIALS OR USED IN
23 THE PRODUCTION OF NEW PRODUCTS. THIS TERM EXCLUDES THERMAL TREATMENT OR
24 THE USE OF WASTE AS A FUEL SUBSTITUTE OR FOR ENERGY PRODUCTION.

25 9. "REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION" MEANS A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION
26 CREATED BY PRODUCERS TO IMPLEMENT THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM
27 DESCRIBED IN SECTION 27-2003 OF THIS TITLE.

28 10. "RETAILER" MEANS ANY PERSON WHO OFFERS ARCHITECTURAL PAINT FOR
29 SALE AT RETAIL IN THE STATE.

30 11. "REUSE" MEANS THE RETURN OF A PRODUCT INTO THE ECONOMIC STREAM FOR
31 USE IN THE SAME KIND OF APPLICATION AS THE PRODUCT WAS ORIGINALLY
32 INTENDED TO BE USED, WITHOUT A CHANGE IN THE PRODUCT'S IDENTITY.

33 12. "SELL" OR "SALE" MEANS ANY TRANSFER FOR CONSIDERATION OF TITLE OR
34 THE RIGHT TO USE, FROM A MANUFACTURER OR RETAILER TO A PERSON, INCLUD-
35 ING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, TRANSACTIONS CONDUCTED THROUGH RETAIL SALES
36 OUTLETS, CATALOGS, MAIL, THE TELEPHONE, THE INTERNET, OR ANY ELECTRONIC
37 MEANS; THIS DOES NOT INCLUDE SAMPLES, DONATIONS, AND REUSE.

38 S 27-2003. PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM.

39 1. ON OR BEFORE MARCH FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN, A PRODUCER OR A
40 REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION SHALL SUBMIT A PLAN FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF
41 A PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR APPROVAL. THE PROGRAM
42 SHALL MINIMIZE THE PUBLIC SECTOR INVOLVEMENT IN THE MANAGEMENT OF POST-
43 CONSUMER PAINT BY REDUCING THE GENERATION OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT, NEGO-
44 TIATING AGREEMENTS TO COLLECT, TRANSPORT, REUSE, RECYCLE, AND/OR BURN
45 FOR ENERGY RECOVERY AT AN APPROPRIATELY LICENSED FACILITY POST-CONSUMER
46 PAINT USING ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND MANAGEMENT PRACTICES. THE PROGRAM
47 SHALL MINIMIZE THE PUBLIC SECTOR INVOLVEMENT IN THE MANAGEMENT OF POST-
48 CONSUMER PAINT BY REDUCING THE GENERATION OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT, NEGO-
49 TIATING AGREEMENTS TO COLLECT, TRANSPORT, REUSE, RECYCLE, AND/OR COMBUST
50 FOR ENERGY RECOVERY AT AN APPROPRIATELY AUTHORIZED FACILITY, INCLUDING
51 PERMITTEES, POST-CONSUMER PAINT USING ENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND MANAGEMENT
52 PRACTICES.

53 2. THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE FOR CONVENIENT AND AVAILABLE STATE-WIDE
54 COLLECTION OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT THAT, AT A MINIMUM, PROVIDES AT LEAST
55 ONE PERMANENT COLLECTION SITE LOCATED WITHIN A FIFTEEN MILE RADIUS OF
56 ALL "INCORPORATED CITIES" AND "CENSUS-DESIGNATED PLACES" IN THE STATE;

1 AND ONE ADDITIONAL PERMANENT COLLECTION SITE FOR EVERY THIRTY THOUSAND
2 PEOPLE LOCATED IN THOSE AREAS, UNLESS OTHERWISE APPROVED BY THE DEPART-
3 MENT. WHERE A PERMANENT COLLECTION SITE CANNOT BE LOCATED WITHIN A
4 FIFTEEN MILE RADIUS OF AN INCORPORATED CITY OR CENSUS-DESIGNATED PLACE,
5 THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE FOR AT LEAST ONE COLLECTION EVENT ANNUALLY.
6 THE PROGRAM SHALL NOT CHARGE A FEE TO THE CONSUMER AT THE TIME OF
7 COLLECTION OF POST-CONSUMER ARCHITECTURAL PAINT.

8 3. THE PLAN SUBMITTED TO THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION
9 SHALL:

10 (A) IDENTIFY EACH PRODUCER PARTICIPATING IN THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP
11 PROGRAM AND THE BRANDS OF ARCHITECTURAL PAINT SOLD IN THE STATE COVERED
12 BY THE PROGRAM;

13 (B) IDENTIFY HOW THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION WILL
14 PROVIDE CONVENIENT, STATEWIDE ACCESSIBILITY TO THE PROGRAM;

15 (C) SET FORTH THE PROCESS BY WHICH AN INDEPENDENT AUDITOR WILL BE
16 SELECTED AND IDENTIFY THE CRITERIA USED BY THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE
17 ORGANIZATION IN SELECTING AN INDEPENDENT AUDITOR;

18 (D) IDENTIFY, IN DETAIL, THE EDUCATIONAL AND OUTREACH PROGRAM THAT
19 WILL BE IMPLEMENTED TO INFORM CONSUMERS AND RETAILERS OF THE PROGRAM AND
20 HOW TO PARTICIPATE;

21 (E) IDENTIFY, IN DETAIL, THE OPERATIONAL PLANS FOR INTERACTING WITH
22 RETAILERS ON THE PROPER HANDLING AND MANAGEMENT OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT;

23 (F) INCLUDE THE PROPOSED, AUDITED PAINT ASSESSMENT AS IDENTIFIED IN
24 THIS SECTION AND THE CRITERIA UPON WHICH THE ASSESSMENT IS BASED;

25 (G) INCLUDE THE TARGETED ANNUAL COLLECTION RATE;

26 (H) INCLUDE A DESCRIPTION OF THE INTENDED TREATMENT, STORAGE, TRANS-
27 PORTATION AND DISPOSAL OPTIONS AND METHODS FOR THE COLLECTED POST-CON-
28 SUMER PAINT; AND

29 (I) BE ACCOMPANIED BY A FEE IN THE AMOUNT OF FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR
30 EACH PRODUCER, OR TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR EACH PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP
31 ORGANIZATION TO BE DEPOSITED INTO THE ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATORY ACCOUNT
32 AS ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 72-1009 OF THIS CHAPTER, TO COVER THE REVIEW
33 OF SAID PLAN BY THE DEPARTMENT.

34 4. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL APPROVE OR REJECT A PLAN SUBMITTED UNDER
35 THIS SECTION WITHIN NINETY DAYS OF SUBMISSION AND, IF REJECTED, INFORM
36 THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION IN WRITING AS TO ANY DEFICIENCIES
37 IN SAID PLAN. A PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION SHALL
38 AMEND AND RESUBMIT ANY REJECTED PLANS FOR RECONSIDERATION WITHIN SIXTY
39 DAYS OF NOTIFICATION OF THE REJECTION OF SAID PLAN. THE COMMISSIONER
40 SHALL APPROVE OR REJECT SAID PLAN WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF RESUBMISSION. A
41 PLAN SHALL BE APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER IF IT MEETS THE REQUIRED
42 ELEMENTS UNDER SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS SECTION.

43 5. NOT LATER THAN THREE MONTHS AFTER THE DATE THE PLAN IS APPROVED,
44 THE REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION SHALL IMPLEMENT THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP
45 PROGRAM.

46 6. ON OR BEFORE MARCH FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN, THE PROPOSED
47 UNIFORM PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT FOR ALL ARCHITECTURAL PAINT SOLD IN
48 THE STATE SHALL BE REVIEWED BY AN INDEPENDENT AUDITOR TO ASSURE THAT THE
49 ASSESSMENT IS CONSISTENT WITH THE BUDGET OF THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP
50 PROGRAM DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION AND THE INDEPENDENT AUDITOR SHALL
51 RECOMMEND AN AMOUNT FOR THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT TO THE DEPART-
52 MENT. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL APPROVE THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT
53 BASED UPON THE INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S RECOMMENDATION. THE DEPARTMENT
54 SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE APPROVAL OF SUCH PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESS-
55 MENT BASED UPON THE INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S RECOMMENDATION. IF THE PAINT
56 STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT PREVIOUSLY APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO

1 THIS SECTION IS PROPOSED TO BE CHANGED, THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE
2 ORGANIZATION SHALL SUBMIT THE NEW, ADJUSTED UNIFORM PAINT STEWARDSHIP
3 ASSESSMENT TO AN INDEPENDENT AUDITOR FOR REVIEW. AFTER SUCH REVIEW HAS
4 BEEN COMPLETED, THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION SHALL SUBMIT
5 THE RESULTS OF SAID AUDITOR'S REVIEW AND A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE PAINT
6 STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR REVIEW. THE DEPARTMENT
7 SHALL REVIEW AND APPROVE, IN WRITING, THE ADJUSTED PAINT STEWARDSHIP
8 ASSESSMENT BEFORE THE NEW ASSESSMENT CAN BE IMPLEMENTED. ANY PROPOSED
9 CHANGES TO THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE
10 DEPARTMENT NO LATER THAN SIXTY DAYS PRIOR TO THE DATE THE PRODUCER OR
11 REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION ANTICIPATES THE ADJUSTED ASSESSMENT TO TAKE
12 EFFECT.

13 7. ON AND AFTER THE DATE OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP
14 PROGRAM PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT SHALL
15 BE ADDED TO THE COST OF ALL ARCHITECTURAL PAINT SOLD TO RETAILERS AND
16 DISTRIBUTORS IN THE STATE BY EACH PRODUCER. ON AND AFTER SUCH IMPLEMEN-
17 TATION DATE, EACH RETAILER OR DISTRIBUTOR, AS APPLICABLE, SHALL ADD THE
18 AMOUNT OF SUCH PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESSMENT TO THE PURCHASE PRICE OF ALL
19 ARCHITECTURAL PAINT SOLD IN THE STATE.

20 8. ANY RETAILER MAY PARTICIPATE, ON A VOLUNTARY BASIS, AS A PAINT
21 COLLECTION POINT PURSUANT TO SUCH PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM AND IN
22 ACCORDANCE WITH ANY APPLICABLE PROVISION OF LAW OR REGULATION.

23 9. EACH PRODUCER AND THE REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION SHALL BE IMMUNE
24 FROM LIABILITY FOR ANY CLAIM OF A VIOLATION OF ANTITRUST LAW OR UNFAIR
25 TRADE PRACTICE IF SUCH CONDUCT IS A VIOLATION OF ANTITRUST LAW, TO THE
26 EXTENT SUCH PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION IS EXERCISING
27 AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

28 10. NOT LATER THAN THE IMPLEMENTATION DATE OF THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP
29 PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL LIST THE NAMES OF PARTICIPATING PRODUCERS
30 AND THE BRANDS OF ARCHITECTURAL PAINT COVERED BY SUCH PAINT STEWARDSHIP
31 PROGRAM ON ITS WEBSITE.

32 11. (A) ON AND AFTER THE IMPLEMENTATION DATE OF THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP
33 PROGRAM, NO PRODUCER, DISTRIBUTOR OR RETAILER SHALL SELL OR OFFER FOR
34 SALE ARCHITECTURAL PAINT TO ANY PERSON IN THE STATE IF THE PRODUCER OF
35 SUCH ARCHITECTURAL PAINT IS NOT A MEMBER OF THE REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZA-
36 TION.

37 (B) NO RETAILER OR DISTRIBUTOR SHALL BE FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF
38 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION IF, ON THE DATE THE ARCHITECTURAL PAINT
39 WAS ORDERED FROM THE PRODUCER OR ITS AGENT, THE PRODUCER OR THE SUBJECT
40 BRAND OF ARCHITECTURAL PAINT WAS LISTED ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE IN
41 ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

42 12. PRODUCERS OR THE REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION SHALL PROVIDE RETAIL-
43 ERS WITH EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS REGARDING THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP ASSESS-
44 MENT AND PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM TO BE DISTRIBUTED AT THE POINT OF
45 SALE TO THE CONSUMER. SUCH MATERIALS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED
46 TO, INFORMATION REGARDING AVAILABLE END-OF-LIFE MANAGEMENT OPTIONS FOR
47 ARCHITECTURAL PAINT OFFERED THROUGH THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM AND
48 INFORMATION THAT NOTIFIES CONSUMERS THAT A CHARGE FOR THE OPERATION OF
49 SUCH PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM IS INCLUDED IN THE PURCHASE PRICE OF ALL
50 ARCHITECTURAL PAINT SOLD IN THE STATE.

51 13. ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER FIFTEENTH, TWO THOUSAND SEVENTEEN, AND ANNU-
52 ALLY THEREAFTER, EACH OPERATOR OF A PROGRAM SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE
53 COMMISSIONER THAT DETAILS THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM FOR THE PRIOR
54 YEAR'S PROGRAM FROM JULY FIRST TO JUNE THIRTIETH. SAID REPORT SHALL
55 INCLUDE A COPY OF THE INDEPENDENT AUDIT DETAILED IN PARAGRAPH (D) OF
56 THIS SUBDIVISION. SUCH ANNUAL REPORT SHALL INCLUDE:

1 (A) A DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF THE METHODS USED TO COLLECT, TRANSPORT
2 AND PROCESS POST-CONSUMER PAINT IN THE STATE INCLUDING DETAILING
3 COLLECTION METHODS MADE AVAILABLE TO CONSUMERS AND AN EVALUATION OF THE
4 PROGRAM'S COLLECTION CONVENIENCE;

5 (B) THE OVERALL VOLUME OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT COLLECTED IN THE STATE;

6 (C) THE VOLUME AND TYPE OF POST-CONSUMER PAINT COLLECTED IN THE STATE
7 BY METHOD OF DISPOSITION, INCLUDING REUSE, RECYCLING AND OTHER METHODS
8 OF PROCESSING OR DISPOSAL;

9 (D) THE TOTAL COST OF IMPLEMENTING THE PROGRAM, AS DETERMINED BY AN
10 INDEPENDENT FINANCIAL AUDIT, AS PERFORMED BY AN INDEPENDENT AUDITOR;

11 (E) AN EVALUATION OF THE ADEQUACY OF THE PROGRAM'S FUNDING MECHANISM;

12 (F) SAMPLES OF ALL EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS PROVIDED TO CONSUMERS OF
13 ARCHITECTURAL PAINT AND RETAILERS;

14 (G) A DETAILED LIST OF EFFORTS UNDERTAKEN AND AN EVALUATION OF THE
15 METHODS USED TO DISSEMINATE SUCH MATERIALS INCLUDING RECOMMENDATIONS, IF
16 ANY, FOR HOW THE EDUCATIONAL COMPONENT OF THE PROGRAM CAN BE IMPROVED;
17 AND

18 (H) THE ANNUAL REPORT SHALL BE ACCOMPANIED BY A FEE IN THE AMOUNT OF
19 THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS TO BE DEPOSITED INTO THE ENVIRONMENTAL REGULATORY
20 ACCOUNT, ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION 72-1009 OF THIS CHAPTER TO
21 COVER THE REVIEW OF SAID PLAN BY THE DEPARTMENT.

22 14. THE REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION SHALL UPDATE THE PLAN, AS NEEDED,
23 WHEN THERE ARE CHANGES PROPOSED TO THE CURRENT PROGRAM. A NEW PLAN OR
24 AMENDMENT WILL BE REQUIRED TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR
25 APPROVAL WHEN:

26 (A) THERE IS A CHANGE TO THE AMOUNT OF THE ASSESSMENT; OR

27 (B) THERE IS AN ADDITION TO THE PRODUCTS COVERED UNDER THE PROGRAM; OR

28 (C) THERE IS A REVISION OF THE PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP ORGANIZATION'S
29 GOALS; OR

30 (D) EVERY FOUR YEARS, IF REQUESTED, IN WRITING, BY THE DEPARTMENT.

31 THE OPERATOR OF THE PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM SHALL NOTIFY THE DEPART-
32 MENT ANNUALLY, IN WRITING, IF THERE ARE NO CHANGES PROPOSED TO THE
33 PROGRAM AND THE PRODUCER OR REPRESENTATIVE ORGANIZATION INTENDS TO
34 CONTINUE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM AS PREVIOUSLY APPROVED BY THE
35 DEPARTMENT.

36 S 27-2005. REGULATIONS.

37 THE DEPARTMENT IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGU-
38 LATIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT AND CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF
39 THIS TITLE.
