AN ACT to amend the executive law and the agriculture and markets law, in relation to therapy dogs and cats for persons with disabilities

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 21 of section 292 of the executive law, as 2 amended by chapter 269 of the laws of 1997, is amended to read as 3 follows:

4 21. The term "disability" means (a) a physical, mental or medical 5 impairment resulting from anatomical, physiological, genetic or neurological conditions which prevents the exercise of a normal bodily function, SUBSTANTIALLY LIMITS ONE OR MORE OF SUCH PERSON'S MAJOR LIFE 7 8 ACTIVITIES, or is demonstrable by medically accepted clinical or labora-9 tory diagnostic techniques or (b) a record of such an impairment or a condition regarded by others as such an impairment, provided, however, 10 that in all provisions of this article dealing with employment, the term 11 12 shall be limited to disabilities which, upon the provision of reasonable 13 accommodations, do not prevent the complainant from performing in a reasonable manner the activities involved in the 14 job or occupation FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES 15 held. 16 INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, CARING FOR ONESELF, PERFORMING 17 TASKS, SEEING, HEARING, EATING, SLEEPING, WALKING, STANDING, LIFTING, BENDING, SPEAKING, BREATHING, LEARNING, READING, CONCENTRATING, 18 19 COMMUNICATING, AND WORKING. MAJOR LIFE ACTIVITIES ALSO INCLUDE THE 20 OPERATION OF A MAJOR BODILY FUNCTION, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED IMMUNE SYSTEM, NORMAL CELL GROWTH, DIGESTIVE, BOWEL, 21 FUNCTIONS OF THEBLADDER, NEUROLOGICAL, BRAIN, RESPIRATORY, CIRCULATORY, ENDOCRINE, 22 23 REPRODUCTIVE FUNCTIONS.

24 S 2. Subdivision 14 of section 296 of the executive law, as amended by 25 chapter 536 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:

It shall be an unlawful discriminatory practice for any person engaged in any activity covered by this section to discriminate against a blind person, a hearing impaired person or a person with another disability on the basis of his or her use of a guide dog, hearing dog or service dog, REGARDLESS OF BREED, OR ANY OTHER THERAPY DOG OR CAT. S 3. Subdivision 26 of section 108 of the agriculture and markets law,

- S 3. Subdivision 26 of section 108 of the agriculture and markets law, as amended by chapter 536 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:
- 26. "Therapy dog OR CAT" means any dog OR CAT that is trained to aid the emotional and physical health of patients in hospitals, nursing homes, retirement homes, PERSONAL RESIDENCES, and other settings and is actually used for such purpose, or any dog OR CAT during the period such dog OR CAT is being trained or bred for such purpose.
- S 4. Subdivision 1 of section 356 of the executive law is amended to read as follows:
- 1. A state veterans' service agency established by the division pursuant to this article shall have power and it shall be its duty to inform military and naval authorities of the United States and assist members of the armed forces and veterans, who are residents of this state, their families, in relation to (1) matters pertaining to educational training and retraining services and facilities, (2) health, medical and rehabilitation services and facilities, (3) provisions of federal, state and local laws and regulations affording special rights and privileges members of the armed forces and war veterans and their families, (4) employment and re-employment services, [and] (5) HOUSING INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO INSTANCES OF DISCRIMINATION, AND (6) other matters of similar, related or appropriate nature. The state veterans' service agency also shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the state director.
- 30 S 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
