AN ACT to amend the education law, the civil service law, the social services law and the public officers law, in relation to the dates of certain periods of war and hostilities

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 668 of the education law, as amended by chapter 580 of the laws of 1992, paragraphs (a) and (d) as amended by chapter 261 of the laws of 1995, paragraph (b) as amended by chapter 616 of the laws of 1995, paragraphs (f) and (g) as added by chapter 435 of the laws of 2006, is amended to read as follows:

- 1. Period of military service. For a student to be eligible, the parent, or step-parent where the student is the dependent of the step-parent, (i) must have been a recipient of the armed forces expeditionary medal, the navy expeditionary medal or the marine corps expeditionary medal for participation in operations in Lebanon from [June first] AUGUST TWENTY-FIRST, nineteen hundred [eighty-three] EIGHTY-TWO to December first, nineteen hundred eighty-seven, in Grenada from October twenty-third, nineteen hundred eighty-three to November twenty-first, nineteen hundred eighty-three, or in Panama from December twentieth, nineteen hundred eighty-nine to January thirty-first, nineteen hundred ninety, or (ii) must have served on regular active duty (other than for training) in the armed forces of the United States during part of one of the following periods:
- (a) April sixth, nineteen hundred seventeen to November eleven, nineteen hundred eighteen.
- (b) December seven, nineteen hundred forty-one to December thirty-one, nineteen hundred forty-six, or have been employed by the War Shipping Administration or Office of Defense Transportation or their agents as a

merchant seaman documented by the United States Coast Guard or Department of Commerce, or as a civil servant employed by the United States 3 Transport Service (later redesignated as the United States Army Transportation Corps, Water Division) or the Naval Transportation 5 Service; and who served satisfactorily as a crew member during the peri-6 od of armed conflict, December seventh, nineteen hundred forty-one, to 7 August fifteenth, nineteen hundred forty-five, aboard merchant vessels 8 in oceangoing, i.e., foreign, intercoastal, or coastwise service as such 9 terms are defined under federal law (46 USCA 10301 & 10501) and further 10 include "near foreign" voyages between the United States and Canada, 11 Mexico, or the West Indies via ocean routes, or public vessels in ocean-12 going service or foreign waters and who has received a Certificate of 13 Release or Discharge from Active Duty and a discharge certificate, or an 14 Honorable Service Certificate/Report of Casualty, from the Department of 15 Defense or have served as a United States civilian employed by the Amer-16 ican Field Service and served overseas under United States Armies and 17 United States Army Groups in world war II during the period of 18 conflict, December seventh, nineteen hundred forty-one through May 19 eighth, nineteen hundred forty-five, and who was discharged or released 20 therefrom under honorable conditions, or have served as a United States 21 civilian Flight Crew and Aviation Ground Support Employee of Pan Ameri-22 World Airways or one of its subsidiaries or its affiliates and served overseas as a result of Pan American's contract with Air Trans-23 24 port Command or Naval Air Transport Service during the period of armed 25 conflict, December fourteenth, nineteen hundred forty-one through August 26 fourteenth, nineteen hundred forty-five, and who was discharged or 27 released therefrom under honorable conditions. 28

- (c) June twenty-seven, nineteen hundred fifty to January thirty-one, nineteen hundred fifty-five.
- (d) [December twenty-second] FEBRUARY TWENTY-EIGHTH, nineteen hundred sixty-one to May seventh, nineteen hundred seventy-five.
- (e) August [two] SECOND, nineteen hundred ninety to the end of hostilities in the Persian Gulf conflict.
- (f) From September eighteenth, two thousand one until the end of the United States military efforts in Afghanistan.
- (g) From October sixteenth, two thousand two until the end of the United States military efforts in Iraq.
- (H) ANY OTHER PERIOD OF WAR OR HOSTILITIES IN SUCH LOCATIONS AND DURING SUCH PERIODS OF TIME AS SHALL BE DETERMINED FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE OR THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS.
- S 2. Subdivision 1 of section 668-c of the education law, as added by chapter 474 of the laws of 2000, is amended to read as follows:
- 1. Eligible students. Awards shall be made to Vietnam veterans' resident children born with Spina Bifida enrolled in approved undergraduate or graduate programs at degree granting institutions. For the purpose of this section, "Vietnam veteran" shall mean a person who served in Indochina at any time from the [twenty-second] TWENTY-EIGHTH day of [December] FEBRUARY, nineteen hundred sixty-one, to and including the seventh day of May, nineteen hundred seventy-five and was honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States; "born with Spina Bifida" shall mean a diagnosis at birth of such disease inclusive of all forms, manifestations, complications and associated medical conditions thereof, but shall not include Spina Bifida Occulta. Such diagnosis shall be in accordance with the provisions of the federal Spina Bifida program and shall be documented by the United States Administration of Veterans' Affairs.

S 3. Subparagraph 5 of paragraph (c) of subdivision 1 of section 85 of the civil service law, as added by chapter 467 of the laws of 1991, is amended and a new subparagraph 9 is added to read as follows:

- (5) Hostilities participated in by the military forces of the United States in Lebanon, from the [first] TWENTY-FIRST day of [June] AUGUST, nineteen hundred [eighty-three] EIGHTY-TWO to the first day of December, nineteen hundred eighty-seven, as established by receipt of the armed forces expeditionary medal, the navy expeditionary medal, or the marine corps expeditionary medal.
- (9) ANY OTHER HOSTILITIES OR PERIOD OF WAR PARTICIPATED IN BY THE MILITARY FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES IN SUCH LOCATIONS AND DURING SUCH PERIODS OF TIME AS SHALL BE DETERMINED FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE OR THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS.
- S 4. Subdivision 1 of section 168 of the social services law, as amended by chapter 467 of the laws of 1991, is amended to read as follows:
- 1. Veteran means a person, male or female, who has served in the armed forces of the United States in time of war, or who was a recipient of the armed forces expeditionary medal, navy expeditionary medal or marine corps expeditionary medal for participation in operations in Lebanon from [June first, nineteen hundred eighty-three] AUGUST TWENTY-FIRST, NINETEEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO to December first, nineteen hundred eighty-seven, in Grenada from October twenty-third, nineteen hundred eighty-three to November twenty-first, nineteen hundred eighty-three, or in Panama from December twentieth, nineteen hundred eighty-nine to January thirty-first, nineteen hundred ninety, and who has been honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances from such service or furloughed to the reserve.
- S 5. Subdivision 2 of section 168 of the social services law is amended by adding a new paragraph 9 to read as follows:
- (9) ANY OTHER PERIOD OF WAR $\stackrel{-}{\text{OR}}$ HOSTILITIES IN SUCH LOCATIONS AND DURING SUCH PERIODS OF TIME AS SHALL BE DETERMINED FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE OR THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS.
- S 6. Section 63 of the public officers law, as amended by chapter 179 of the laws of 2006, is amended to read as follows:
- S 63. Leave of absence for veterans on Memorial day and Veterans' day. It shall be the duty of the head of every public department and of every court of the state of New York, of every superintendent or foreman on the public works of said state, of the county officers of the several said state, of the town officers of the various towns in this state, of the fire district officers of the various fire districts in this state, and of the head of every department, bureau and office in the government of the various cities and villages in this state, and the officers of any public benefit corporation or any public authority of this state, or of any public benefit corporation or public authority of any county or subdivision of this state, to give leave of absence with pay for twenty-four hours on the day prescribed by law as a public holiday for the observance of Memorial day and on the eleventh day of November, known as Veterans' day, to every person in the service of the state, the county, the town, the fire district, the city or village, the public benefit corporation or public authority of this state, or any public benefit corporation or public authority of any county or subdivision of this state, as the case may be, (i) who served on active duty in the armed forces of the United States during world war I or world war II, or who was employed by the War Shipping Administration or Office of Defense Transportation or their agents as a merchant seaman documented

by the United States Coast Guard or Department of Commerce, or as a civil servant employed by the United States Army Transport (later redesignated as the United States Army Transportation Corps, Water Division) or the Naval Transportation Service; and who served satisfactorily as a crew member during the period of armed conflict, December seventh, nineteen hundred forty-one, to August fifteenth, nine-5 6 7 teen hundred forty-five, aboard merchant vessels in oceangoing, i.e., 8 foreign, intercoastal, or coastwise service as such terms are defined under federal law (46 USCA 10301 & 10501) and further to include "near 9 10 foreign" voyages between the United States and Canada, Mexico, 11 West Indies via ocean routes, or public vessels in oceangoing service or foreign waters and who has received a Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty and a discharge certificate, or an Honorable 12 13 14 Service Certificate/Report of Casualty, from the Department of Defense, 15 or who served as a United States civilian employed by the American Field 16 Service and served overseas under United States Armies and United States Army Groups in world war II during the period of armed conflict, Decem-17 seventh, nineteen hundred forty-one through May eighth, nineteen 18 19 hundred forty-five, and who was discharged or released therefrom under honorable conditions, or who served as a United States civilian Flight 20 21 Crew and Aviation Ground Support Employee of Pan American World Airways 22 one of its subsidiaries or its affiliates and served overseas as a 23 result of Pan American's contract with Air Transport Command or Naval Transport Service during the period of armed conflict, December 24 25 fourteenth, nineteen hundred forty-one through August fourteenth, teen hundred forty-five, and who was discharged or released therefrom under honorable conditions, or during the period of the Korean conflict 26 27 any time between the dates of June twenty-seventh, nineteen hundred 28 29 fifty and January thirty-first, nineteen hundred fifty-five, or during 30 the period of the Vietnam conflict from the twenty-eighth day of February, nineteen hundred sixty-one to the seventh day of May, nineteen 31 32 hundred seventy-five, or (ii) who served on active duty in the armed 33 forces of the United States and who was a recipient of the armed forces expeditionary medal, navy expeditionary medal or marine corps expeditionary medal for participation in operations in Lebanon from [June 34 35 36 first, nineteen hundred eighty-three] AUGUST TWENTY-FIRST, NINETEEN 37 HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO to December first, nineteen hundred eighty-seven, in Grenada from October twenty-third, nineteen hundred eighty-three to November twenty-first, nineteen hundred eighty-three, [or] in Panama 38 39 40 from December twentieth, nineteen hundred eighty-nine to January thirty-first, nineteen hundred ninety, OR DURING ANY OTHER PERIOD OF WAR OR 41 IN SUCH LOCATIONS AND DURING SUCH PERIODS OF TIME AS SHALL 42 HOSTILITIES 43 BE DETERMINED FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE 44 THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS, or (iii) who served in the armed forces of a foreign country allied with the United States during world war I or 45 world war II, or during the period of the Korean conflict at any time 46 47 between June twenty-seventh, nineteen hundred fifty and January thirty-48 first, nineteen hundred fifty-five, or during the period of the Vietnam conflict from the twenty-eighth day of February, nineteen hundred 49 50 sixty-one to the seventh day of May, nineteen hundred seventy-five, or during the period of the Persian Gulf conflict from the second day of 51 August, nineteen hundred ninety to the end of such conflict, or who served on active duty in the army or navy or marine corps or air force 52 53 or coast guard of the United States, and who was honorably discharged or 54 55 separated from such service under honorable conditions, except where such action would endanger the public safety or the safety or health of 56

persons cared for by the state, in which event such persons shall be entitled to leave of absence with pay on another day in lieu thereof. All such persons who are compensated on a per diem, hourly, semi-monthly or monthly basis, with or without maintenance, shall also be entitled to leave of absence with pay under the provisions of this section and no deduction in vacation allowance or budgetary allowable number of working days shall be made in lieu thereof. A refusal to give such leave of absence to one entitled thereto shall be neglect of duty.

- S 7. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, any provisions of law which grant benefits or eligibility to veterans who served in the armed forces of the United States during a period of war or hostilities, such period shall include any additional period of war or hostilities in such locations and during such periods of time as shall be determined from time to time by the federal Department of Defense or the United States Congress.
- 16 S 8. This act shall take effect immediately.
