AN ACT to amend the mental hygiene law, in relation to the distribution of educational materials regarding the misuse of and addiction to prescription drugs

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Section 19.09 of the mental hygiene law is amended by 2 adding a new subdivision (j) to read as follows:
- 3 COMMISSIONER, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF THEHEALTH, SHALL CREATE OR UTILIZE EXISTING EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS 5 SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION REGARDING THE DANGERS OF MISUSE AND THE POTEN-6 TIAL FOR ADDICTION TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS, TREATMENT RESOURCES AVAILABLE, 7 THE PROPER WAY TO DISPOSE OF UNUSED PRESCRIPTION DRUGS. 8 RIALS SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE TO PHARMACISTS AND MAY BE DISTRIBUTED WITH 9 ANY PRESCRIBED DRUG THAT IS A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE BY A PHARMACIST 10 LICENSED BY $_{
 m THE}$ STATE TO DISPENSE PRESCRIPTION DRUGS TO THE PUBLIC 11 PURSUANT TO SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED FIVE OF THE EDUCATION INFORMATION CONTAINED IN SUCH MATERIALS SHALL ALSO BE POSTED ON THE 12 13 WEBSITE OF THE OFFICE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. SUCH MATERIALS SHALL BE PROVIDED IN LANGUAGES OTHER THAN ENGLISH AS DEEMED APPROPRIATE BY THE 14 15 COMMISSIONERS.
 - (2) UTILIZING DATA THAT IS AVAILABLE TO THE OFFICE, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, INFORMATION OBTAINED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION FOUR OF SECTION THIRTY-THREE HUNDRED NINE-A OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, THE COMMISSIONER IDENTIFY THE COUNTIES IN NEW YORK STATE WHERE PRESCRIPTION OPIOID ABUSE IS MOST PREVALENT. PHARMACISTS LICENSED BY THE STATE TO DISPENSE PRESCRIPTION DRUGS MAY BE NOTIFIED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE COMMISSIONER COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, ABOUT THE PREVALENCE OF OPIOID ABUSE IN THE COUNTY IN WHICH SUCH PHARMACISTS ARE LOCATED AND ENCOURAGE THEFACILITIES WHERE PRESCRIPTION DRUGS ARE DISPENSED TO DISTRIBUTE MATERIALS CREATED OR UTILIZED PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH THIS SUBDIVISION.
