AN ACT to amend the correction law, in relation to human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) prevention

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 76 of the correction law, as amended by chapter 5 of the laws of 2015, is amended to read as follows: 1. (a) Prior to the release of an inmate from a correctional facility, the department shall provide such inmate with information on transitional services available in the county or city where such inmate is scheduled to be released. Such information shall include programs designed to promote the successful and productive reentry and reinte-8 gration of an inmate into society including medical and mental health services, HIV/AIDS services, educational, vocational and employment 10 services, alcohol or substance abuse treatment and housing services. The department shall maintain a current list of transitional services which shall be updated regularly in order to effectuate the purposes of this section. Where appropriate, the department shall provide assistance to 14 an inmate in contacting a program or service provider prior to such inmate's release to the community.

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(b) Upon discharge of an inmate from a correctional facility, the 17 <u>department</u> shall provide such inmate with educational information about 18 the prevention of human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) infection, instructions about how to obtain free HIV testing upon release, includ-20 ing contact information for HIV counseling and testing service providers 21 located in the county or city in which such inmate intends to reside
