AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to method of payment pricing of gasoline

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The section heading of section 399-ee of the general business law, as added by chapter 579 of the laws of 2008, is amended to  
2 read as follows:

3 Zone pricing and method of payment pricing of gasoline prohibited.

4 § 2. Subdivision 1 of section 399-ee of the general business law is  
5 amended by adding two new paragraphs (n) and (o) to read as follows:

6 (n) "Method of payment" means the manner in which a customer pays for  
7 motor fuel at a retail outlet using cash, check, debit card, credit card  
8 or a similar means of payment.

9 (o) "Method of payment pricing" means differences in the price per  
10 gallon of motor fuel of like grade or quality offered for sale or sold  
11 by a retail outlet based on the customer's method of payment.

12 § 3. Subdivision 3 of section 399-ee of the general business law is  
13 renumbered subdivision 4 and a new subdivision 3 is added to read as  
14 follows:

15 3. No dealer shall engage in method of payment pricing with respect to  
16 any motor fuel of like grade or quality, except that the dealer may  
17 impose a charge for the use of a credit or debit card in an amount not  
18 to exceed the greater of the transaction fee incurred by the dealer for  
19 processing the credit or debit card purchase or three percent of the  
20 cash price.

21 § 4. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall  
22 have become a law.
