AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to school speed limits

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision (a) of section 1620 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by chapter 563 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as follows:

(a) The department of transportation with respect to state highways maintained by the state outside of cities having a population in excess of one million, and highways on Indian reservations, may by order, rule 7 or regulation establish higher or lower maximum speed limits at which vehicles may proceed on or along such highways than the fifty-five miles per hour statutory maximum speed limit. No such maximum speed limit 10 shall be established at less than twenty-five miles per hour, except that school speed limits may be established at not less than fifteen 11 12 miles per hour by the department of transportation or by the legislative 13 body of any county or, if so delegated by such county legislative body, 14 by the legislative body of any municipality or school district located within said county, for a distance not to exceed one thousand three 15 hundred twenty feet, on a highway passing a school building, entrance or 16 exit of a school abutting on the highway. Absence of signs installed 17 pursuant to this section shall be presumptive evidence that the depart-18 19 ment of transportation has not established a higher maximum speed limit 20 than the fifty-five miles per hour statutory limit.

21 § 2. This act shall take effect on the first of November next succeed-22 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
