AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to civil penalties for violations concerning the pharmacy benefit manager contract appeals process; and in relation to the process for appeal

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 280-a of the public health law is amended by adding two new subdivisions 3 and 4 to read as follows:

- 3. Any pharmacy benefit manager who violates the provisions of subdivision two of this section shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars for each violation.
- 4. The attorney general shall bring an action to recover the civil penalties provided by subdivision three of this section and for such other relief as may be deemed necessary.
- 9 § 2. Paragraph (e) of subdivision 2 of section 280-a of the public 10 health law, as added by chapter 540 of the laws of 2015, is amended to 11 read as follows:
- 12 (e) if an appeal is denied, the pharmacy benefit manager shall identi-13 fy [the national drug code of a therapeutically equivalent drug, as determined by the federal Food and Drug Administration, that is available for purchase by pharmacies in this state from wholesalers regis-15 tered purguant to subdivision four of section sixty-eight hundred eight 16 of the education law at a price which is equal to or less than the maxi-17 18 mum allowable cost for that drug as determined by the pharmacy benefit 19 manager in writing: (i) the national drug code of a therapeutically 20 equivalent drug as determined by the food and drug administration that is available for purchase by retail community pharmacies in the same 21 22 package size, (ii) the name of the wholesaler registered pursuant to 23 subdivision four of section sixty-eight hundred eight of the education
