AN ACT to amend the public health law and the state finance law, in relation to the procurement and use of environmentally sensitive commodities and services by hospitals

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2805-z to read as follows:
- § 2805-z. Procurement and use of environmentally sensitive commodities and services. 1. For the purposes of this section the following terms 5
- (a) "Environmentally sensitive commodities and services" means those 7 commodities and services that minimize adverse impacts on the public health and the environment as determined by the commissioner of general services. 9
- (b) "Commodity" or "commodities" means materials, goods, supplies, 10 11 products, construction items and other standard articles of commerce 12 other than technology.
- 13 (c) "Construction item" means any item or material used in 14 construction and which is procured directly by a hospital or by a person 15 <u>under contract by a hospital.</u>
- (d) "Service" or "services" means the performance of a task or tasks 16 17 and may include a material good or a quantity of material goods, and 18 which is subject of any purchase or other exchange. For the purposes of 19 this section, technology shall be deemed a service.
- 20 2. The commissioner of general services, in consultation with the commissioner, shall establish and from time to time amend quidelines and 21 specifications for environmentally sensitive commodities and services 23 for use in hospitals; and for use in the construction, renovation or

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repair of hospital buildings and related facilities. Such quidelines shall be used to identify environmentally sensitive commodities and services which are available in the form, function and utility generally used by such facilities. Such commissioners shall review and evaluate existing research regarding environmentally sensitive commodities and services, including but not limited to, the United States environmental protection agency's quidelines for environmentally sensitive commodities and services, for the purpose of developing appropriate criteria for such guidelines and specifications.

- 3. The commissioner of general services shall disseminate to all hospitals guidelines and specifications for the purchase or use of environmentally sensitive commodities and services in hospitals; and for use in the construction, renovation or repair of hospital buildings and related facilities. The commissioner of general services shall also prepare and disseminate to all hospitals a sample list of such environmentally sensitive commodities and services that meet these guidelines or specifications and their environmental and health benefits. Every hospital shall consider such guidelines, specifications and sample list when making determinations as to the purchase of commodities, construction items or services for use in the hospital, or for use in the construction, renovation, or repair of hospital buildings.
- 4. On or before June first, two thousand nineteen, the office of general services and the department shall jointly issue a report providing an analysis of the impact of such guidelines and specifications on the purchasing and procurement practices of hospitals.
- § 2. Paragraph b of subdivision 3 of section 163 of the state finance law is amended by adding a new subparagraph (xiii) to read as follows:
- (xiii) maintain a list of firms which produce or manufacture or offer for sale environmentally sensitive commodities and services in the form, function, and utility generally used by hospitals in accordance with specifications or quidelines promulgated pursuant to section twentyeight hundred five-z of the public health law.
- § 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 34 it shall have become a law; provided that the commissioners of health 35 and general services are authorized to promulgate any and all rules and 36 regulations and take any other measures necessary to implement the provisions of this act on its effective date on or before such date; and 38 provided, further, that the amendment to paragraph b of subdivision 3 of 39 section 163 of the state finance law, made by section two of this act, shall not affect the repeal of such section and shall be deemed repealed 40 41 therewith.
