AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to
allowing bed and breakfasts to sell cider, liquor, beer and wine

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assem-
bly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 4 of section 51 of the alcoholic beverage
2 control law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is amended
3 to read as follows:

4 4. A licensed brewery may operate a restaurant, hotel, an establish-
5 ment designated and commonly known and operated as a bed and breakfast,
6 catering establishment, or other food and drinking establishment in or
7 adjacent to the licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for
8 consumption on the premises, beer manufactured by the licensee and any
9 New York state labeled beer. All of the provisions of this chapter rela-
10 tive to licenses to sell beer at retail for consumption on the premises
11 shall apply so far as applicable to such licensee. Notwithstanding any
12 other provision of law, the licensed brewer may apply to the liquor
13 authority for a license to sell beer, wine or liquor at retail for
14 consumption on the premises at such establishment. All of the provisions
15 of this chapter relative to licenses to sell beer, wine or liquor at
16 retail for consumption on the premises shall apply so far as applicable
17 to such application.

18 § 2. Paragraph (g) of subdivision 2 of section 51-a of the alcoholic
19 beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is
20 amended to read as follows:

21 (g) operate a restaurant, hotel, an establishment designated and
22 commonly known and operated as a bed and breakfast, catering establish-
23 ment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the
24 licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on
25 the premises, beer and cider manufactured by the licensee and any New

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1 York state labeled beer or New York state labeled cider. All of the
2 provisions of this chapter relative to licenses to sell beer at retail
3 for consumption on and off the premises shall apply so far as applicable
4 to such licensee. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the
5 licensed farm brewery may apply to the authority for a license under
6 this chapter to sell other alcoholic beverages at retail for consumption
7 on the premises at such establishment;

8 § 3. Subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (f) of subdivision 2 of section
9 58-c of the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of
10 the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:

11 (ii) operate a restaurant, hotel, an establishment designated and
12 commonly known and operated as a bed and breakfast, catering establish-
13 ment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the
14 licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on
15 the premises, cider manufactured by the licensee and any New York state
16 labeled cider. All of the provisions of this chapter relative to licen-
17 sees to selling cider at retail shall apply. Notwithstanding any other
18 provision of law, the licensed farm cidery may apply to the authority
19 for a license under this chapter to sell other alcoholic beverages at
20 retail for consumption on the premises at such establishment;

21 § 4. Subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (e) of subdivision 2-c of section
22 61 of the alcoholic beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of
23 the laws of 2014, is amended to read as follows:

24 (ii) operate a restaurant, hotel, an establishment designated and
25 commonly known and operated as a bed and breakfast, catering establish-
26 ment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the
27 licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on
28 the premises, liquor manufactured by the licensee and any New York state
29 labeled liquor. All of the provisions of this chapter relative to
30 licenses to sell liquor at retail for consumption on the premises shall
31 apply so far as applicable to such licensee. Notwithstanding any other
32 provision of law, the licensee may apply to the authority for a license
33 under this chapter to sell other alcoholic beverages at retail for
34 consumption on the premises at such establishment.

35 § 5. Subdivision 5-a of section 64 of the alcoholic beverage control
36 law, as added by chapter 480 of the laws of 2003, is amended to read as
37 follows:

38 5-a. Notwithstanding the provisions of subdivision five of this
39 section, a liquor license may be issued under this section to an estab-
40 lishment designated and commonly known and operated as a "bed and break-
41 fast" regardless of whether or not a restaurant is operated in such
42 establishment[~~, provided that such license shall only permit the sale of~~
43 ~~alcoholic beverages to overnight guests of such establishment~~].

44 § 6. Subdivision 4-a of section 76 of the alcoholic beverage control
45 law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is amended to read
46 as follows:

47 4-a. A licensed winery may operate a restaurant, hotel, an establish-
48 ment designated and commonly known as a bed and breakfast, catering
49 establishment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent
50 to the licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consump-
51 tion on the premises, wine and wine products manufactured by the licen-
52 see and any New York state labeled wine or New York state labeled wine
53 product. All of the provisions of this chapter relative to licenses to
54 sell wine at retail for consumption on the premises shall apply so far
55 as applicable to such licensee. Notwithstanding any other provision of
56 law, the licensed winery may apply to the authority for a license under

1 article four of this chapter to sell other alcoholic beverages at retail
2 for consumption on the premises at such establishment.

3 § 7. Paragraph (f) of subdivision 2 of section 76-a of the alcoholic
4 beverage control law, as amended by chapter 431 of the laws of 2014, is
5 amended to read as follows:

6 (f) operate a restaurant, hotel, an establishment designated and
7 commonly known and operated as a bed and breakfast, catering establish-
8 ment, or other food and drinking establishment in or adjacent to the
9 licensed premises and sell at such place, at retail for consumption on
10 the premises, wine, cider and wine products manufactured by the licensee
11 and any New York state labeled wine, New York state labeled cider or New
12 York state labeled wine product. All of the provisions of this chapter
13 relative to licenses to sell wine at retail for consumption on the prem-
14 ises shall apply so far as applicable to such licensee. Notwithstanding
15 any other provision of law, the licensed winery may apply to the author-
16 ity for a license under article four of this chapter to sell other alco-
17 holic beverages at retail for consumption on the premises at such estab-
18 lishment.

19 § 8. This act shall take effect immediately.
