WHEREAS, The Lunar New Year is the most significant and popular Asian festival and exemplifies the many diverse traditions of Asian-Americans; and

WHEREAS, It is with great celebration in the Asian-American community that public schools in New York City now recognize the Lunar New Year as a holiday, acknowledging the festival's widespread veneration and observance across the city; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to commemorate the Asian-American community's celebration of the Lunar New Year, the Year of the Dog, on February 16, 2018; and be it further
