WHEREAS, Since 1962, the month of May has been declared, by Presidential Proclamation, Older Americans Month in order for communities around the nation to set time aside to celebrate and reflect on the unique role older Americans play in the fabric of our society; and

WHEREAS, The legislative and executive branches of New York State government have as a primary goal the improvement of the quality of life of older New Yorkers and the assurance of their continued dignity; and

WHEREAS, It is the intent of this Legislative Body to recognize and celebrate the legacy of New York's older New Yorkers who have experienced tumultuous changes in the 20th Century, including the dawn of the nuclear age, the rise of the computer, and the proliferation of the automobile, television, technology and so many other innovations of the American spirit, and who now represent a vast and willing source of knowledge available to our great State of New York; now, therefore, be it
