**WHEREAS,** John Diorio began his illustrious career at Archbishop Molloy High School as a history teacher; he continued to use his classroom chalkboard as his most important teaching tool, rather than embracing most new technology, for his entire tenure; and

**WHEREAS,** With a steadfast and unwavering commitment to his students, John Diorio often brought guest lecturers into his classroom, including the late Governor Mario M. Cuomo and late United States Congressman Joseph P. Addabbo, Sr., to speak to students about government and politics; and

**WHEREAS,** This extraordinary man considers his 59 years of teaching and mentoring his life's crowning achievement; and

**WHEREAS,** As a knowledgeable and highly skilled teacher, John Diorio has improved the quality of education at Archbishop Molloy High School by leading and supporting staff with enthusiasm, cultivating a positive and stimulating school environment for his students, and creating a greater sense of community; and

**WHEREAS,** The Queens community is indeed fortunate and blessed to have had such a dedicated and respected educational leader; his wisdom and contributions reached into every classroom, truly making a difference in the lives of those lucky enough to have worked with him; and

**WHEREAS,** A significant contributor to education in New York State, John Diorio has continually demonstrated an impressive dedication, an unparalleled devotion and an unrelenting enthusiasm for the quality of the educational programs and opportunities offered at the Archbishop Molloy High School for the benefit of its faculty and students, as well as for the entire community; and
