WHEREAS, Lance M. Reyes, Sr. was well-liked for not only his talent, but also his humble spirit, infectious personality and tremendous smile; he truly was a friend to everyone; and

WHEREAS, On November 10, 1993, Lance M. Reyes, Sr. married the love of his life, the former Michelle McClendon; together, the couple were blessed with three children; and

WHEREAS, Lance M. Reyes, Sr. was raised in the Glorious Church of God in Christ, under the leadership of his late Uncle, Bishop Perry

- Lindsay, Sr.; he was baptized on October 15, 1993, by his cousin, Bishop David Lindsay, Sr.; and
