AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to health care proxy information on driver's licenses; and to repeal certain provisions of such law relating thereto

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 490 of the vehicle and traffic
2 law, as amended by chapter 465 of the laws of 2012, the third undesig-
3 nated paragraph as amended by chapter 248 of the laws of 2016, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 2. Application. Any person to whom a driver's license or learner's
6 permit has not been issued by the commissioner, or whose driver's
7 license or learner's permit is expired, suspended, revoked or surren-
8 dered, may make application to the commissioner for the issuance of an
9 identification card. The commissioner shall ensure that space is
10 provided on the application so that the applicant shall register or
11 decline registration in the donate life registry for organ and tissue
12 donations pursuant to section forty-three hundred ten of the public
13 health law and that the following is stated on the application in clear
14 and conspicuous type:

15 "You must fill out the following section: Would you like to be added
16 to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this ques-
17 tion'."

18 The commissioner of health shall not maintain records of any person
19 who checks "skip this question". Except where the application is made in
20 person or electronically, failure to check a box shall not impair the
21 validity of an application, and failure to check "yes" or checking "skip

1 this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In
2 the case of an applicant under eighteen years of age, checking "yes"
3 shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration
4 in the donate life registry, except as otherwise provided pursuant to
5 the provisions of paragraph (b) of subdivision one of section forty-
6 three hundred one of the public health law. Where an applicant has
7 previously consented to make an anatomical gift or registered in the
8 donate life registry, checking "skip this question" or failing to check
9 a box shall not impair that consent or registration. Additionally, the
10 commissioner shall ensure that space is provided on the application so
11 that the applicant shall indicate a declaration relating to the desig-

23 will? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this question'."

24 The commissioner shall make whatever provisions are feasible and
25 desirable to maintain and issue all suitable documents regarding
26 advanced directives at driver's license examining offices.

27 § 2. Paragraph (b) of subdivision 3 of section 490 of the vehicle and
28 traffic law, as amended by chapter 429 of the laws of 2014, is amended
29 to read as follows:

30 (b) The identification card shall contain a distinguishing number or
31 mark and adequate space upon which an anatomical gift, pursuant to arti-
32 cle forty-three of the public health law, a declaration relating to a
33 health care proxy, pursuant to section twenty-nine hundred eighty-one of
34 the public health law, and a declaration relating to the use of life-
35 sustaining treatments by the holder may be recorded and shall contain
36 such other information and shall be issued in such form as the commis-
37 sioner shall determine; provided, however, every identification card or
38 renewal thereof issued to a person under the age of twenty-one years
39 shall have prominently imprinted thereon the statement "UNDER 21 YEARS
40 OF AGE" in notably distinctive print or format. Provided, further,
41 however, that every identification card issued to an applicant who was a
42 member of the armed forces of the United States and received an honor-
43 able discharge or was released therefrom under honorable conditions
44 shall, upon his or her request and submission of proof as set forth
45 herein, contain a distinguishing mark, in such form as the commissioner
46 shall determine, indicating that he or she is a veteran. Such proof
47 shall consist of a certificate of release or discharge from active duty
48 including but not limited to a DD Form 214 or other proof satisfactory
49 to the commissioner. The commissioner shall not require fees for the
50 issuance of such identification cards or renewals thereof to persons
51 under twenty-one years of age which are different from the fees required
52 for the issuance of identification cards or renewals thereof to persons
53 twenty-one years of age or over, nor fees to persons requesting a veter-
54 an distinguishing mark which are different from fees that would other-
55 wise be required. Provided, however, that notwithstanding the provisions
56 of section four hundred ninety-one of this article, the commissioner

1 shall not require any fees for the duplication or amendment of an identification card prior to its renewal if such duplication or amendment was solely for the purpose of adding a veteran distinguishing mark to such identification card.

5 § 3. Subdivision 1 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as separately amended by chapters 465 and 487 of the laws of 2012, is REPEALED and a new subdivision 1 is added to read as follows:

8 1. Application for license. Application for a driver's license shall be made to the commissioner. The fee prescribed by law may be submitted with such application. The applicant shall furnish such proof of identity, age, and fitness as may be required by the commissioner. Eligibility for a driver's license shall not be conditioned on a particular immigration status. The commissioner may also provide that the application procedure shall include the taking of a photo image or images of the applicant in accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the commissioner. In addition, the commissioner also shall require that the applicant provide his or her social security number where such applicant is a legal immigrant and shall provide space on the application so that the applicant may register in the New York state organ and tissue donor registry under section forty-three hundred ten of the public health law with the following stated on the application in clear and conspicuous type:

23 "You must fill out the following section: Would you like to be added to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this question'."

26 The commissioner of the department of health shall not maintain records of any person who checks "skip this question". Failure to check a box shall not impair the validity of an application, and failure to check "yes" or checking "skip this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under eighteen years of age, checking "yes" shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry. 53 The commissioner shall make whatever provisions are feasible and desirable to maintain and issue all suitable documents regarding advanced directives at driver's license examining offices. In addition, an applicant for a commercial driver's license who will operate a

commercial motor vehicle in interstate commerce shall certify that such applicant meets the requirements to operate a commercial motor vehicle, as set forth in public law 99-570, title XII, and title 49 of the code of federal regulations, and all regulations promulgated by the United States secretary of transportation under the hazardous materials transportation act. In addition, an applicant for a commercial driver's license shall submit a medical certificate at such intervals as required by the federal motor carrier safety improvement act of 1999 and Part 383.71(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations relating to medical certification and in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. For purposes of this section and sections five hundred three, five hundred ten-a, and five hundred ten-aa of this title, the terms "medical certificate" and "medical certification" shall mean a form substantially in compliance with the form set forth in Part 391.43(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations. Upon a determination that the holder of a commercial driver's license has made any false statement, with respect to the application for such license, the commissioner shall revoke such license.

§ 4. Subdivision 1 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as added by section three of this act, is amended to read as follows:

1. Application for license. Application for a driver's license shall be made to the commissioner. The fee prescribed by law may be submitted with such application. The applicant shall furnish such proof of identity, age, and fitness as may be required by the commissioner. Eligibility for a driver's license shall not be conditioned on a particular immigration status. 34 of 2006, is amended to read as follows:

35 (a) Every license or renewal thereof shall contain a distinguishing
36 mark and adequate space upon which an anatomical gift, pursuant to
37 section forty-three hundred ten of the public health law, by the licen-
38 see shall be recorded and shall contain such other information and shall
39 be issued in such form as the commissioner shall determine; provided,
40 however, every license or renewal thereof issued to a person under the
41 age of twenty-one years shall have prominently imprinted upon it the
42 statement "UNDER 21 YEARS OF AGE" in notably distinctive print or
43 format; provided further, however, every license or renewal thereof
44 issued to a person making an anatomical gift shall have prominently
45 printed upon the front of such license or renewal thereof the statement
46 "ORGAN DONOR" in notably distinctive print or format; provided that
47 every license shall have imprinted on the back "Designated health care
48 agent:" followed by a space for the health care agent's name and contact
49 information; and provided further that every license shall have
50 imprinted on the back "Executed declaration relating to life-sustaining
51 treatment:" followed by a space to mark the appropriate box "Yes" or
52 "No". The commissioner shall not require fees for the issuance of such
53 licenses or renewals thereof to persons under twenty-one years of age or
54 to persons making an anatomical gift which are different from the fees
55 required for the issuance of licenses or renewals thereof to persons

1 twenty-one years of age or over or to persons not making an anatomical
2 gift.

3 § 6. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that
4 section three of this act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth
5 day after it shall have become a law, and section four of this act shall
6 take effect October 3, 2019.
