AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to vehicular gang activity

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

- 1 Section 1. The penal law is amended by adding a new section 70.12 to 2 read as follows:
- 3 § 70.12 Sentence of imprisonment for vehicular gang activity.
- 1. Definitions. The term "vehicular offense" shall mean any misdemeanor or felony committed while operating a motor vehicle. The term
 "vehicular gang activity" shall mean the commission of any vehicular
 offense where a person is aided by two or more other persons actually
 present.
- 2. Authorized sentence. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, when a person is convicted of a vehicular gang activity which is a class C, D, or E felony or a misdemeanor, the crime shall be deemed to be one category higher than the crime the person committed, or attempted or conspired to commit.
- 14 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, when a person is 15 convicted of vehicular gang activity which is a class B felony:
- 16 <u>(i) the maximum term of the indeterminate sentence must be at least</u>
 17 <u>six years if the defendant is sentenced pursuant to section 70.00 of</u>
 18 <u>this article;</u>
- 19 <u>(ii) the term of the determinate sentence must be at least eight years</u>
 20 <u>if the defendant is sentenced pursuant to section 70.02 of this article;</u>
- 21 (iii) the term of the determinate sentence must be at least twelve 22 years if the defendant is sentenced pursuant to section 70.04 of this 23 article;
- 24 <u>(iv) the maximum term of the indeterminate sentence or the term of the</u>
 25 <u>determinate sentence must be at least ten years if the defendant is</u>
 26 <u>sentenced pursuant to section 70.06 of this article.</u>
- 27 § 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after 28 it shall have become a law.
