AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to consecutive sentences for homicide offenses

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 70.25 of the penal law, as amended by chapter 56 of the laws of 1984, is amended to read as follows:

2. When more than one sentence of imprisonment is imposed on a person for two or more offenses committed through a single act or omission, or through an act or omission which in itself constituted one of the offenses and also was a material element of the other, the sentences, except if one or more of such sentences is for a violation of section 270.20 of this chapter, must run concurrently. <u>Provided however, that</u> if one or more of such sentences is for a conviction under article one hundred twenty-five of this chapter, the sentences may run consecutive-

12 § 2. This act shall take effect on the first of November next succeed-13 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
